

Reflections From Fr. Robert Carlton: Live In The Light


Wednesday of the second week of Easter features one of the more well-known Gospel passages, which is taken from the third chapter of John: "For everyone who does wicked things hates the light...but whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God." This particular Gospel from John is one of the more famous ones in the Gospels because of the line "God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son," a message that is truly at the core of the entire Gospels. But, right after this line, and in a line that should also be taken as indispensable to the Gospel message, is that Jesus wants us to live in the light—and if you live in the light, you will be transparent and you will follow the prayer that is said when people are ordained deacons in the church: "Believe what you read. Teach what you believe. Practice what you teach."

Notice that it does not say to believe what you think you ought to be reading, or teach what you think your superiors want you to be teaching. It also does not say to disregard things that you do not agree with or to pretend that they are simply not there, nor does it say to limit yourself to only things that are consistent with your preferences. Rather, the prayer says in essence, to be yourself and to be who you actually are.

On one level, this seems obvious, as people are instructed constantly in schools these days to be themselves, and certainly no one would be taken seriously if they actually advocated others trying to act and be like someone else. Also, corporations, the media, politicians, and seemingly everyone who has access to a microphone these days, tend to talk endlessly about transparency and being "true to yourself." However, the fact that people find a need to speak constantly about the importance of transparency would seem to suggest that quite a few people are not actually being particularly transparent, which should not be surprising, but also it would suggest that people do not really want others to be all that transparent with them, as they only appear willing to hear what they want to hear.


One thing that I would hope this Gospel would encourage people to do is to reflect genuinely on the level of transparency in their own lives, and not just in what they are personally doing, but in the level of transparency that they are willing to receive from others. Reasonable people want to receive honest feedback, but how often do you get honest feedback (when it is offered in a genuine way) and simply reject it when it is not what you want to hear? To give one specific example, why is it that people say they want political candidates to speak the truth, but whenever they do speak the truth and tell people what they *need* to hear (and not simply what they *want* to hear), the candidate that does that never seems to win anything? So, remember to live in the light and believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach. - *Fr. Robert*



Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Even Thomas struggles to remove his boulder! Being very pragmatic and determined, he wants to see the risen Christ for himself! Thomas's boulder is heavy with mistrust. Many of ours are too. A certain amount of skepticism is good, as it can save us from being duped or misled. But we can become so skeptical of things that it erodes our ability to trust anything we see or hear. Skepticism can actually be a well-disguised defense mechanism that we use to prevent us from being hurt or perceived as a fool. Having too much ego protection is a real risk. Thomas, because of the boulder blocking his vision, could not even trust the word of his friends.

Boulders are hard to move. It's difficult to seek change or take a risk, especially when we are so afraid to be vulnerable or reluctant to trust another's word. When we are closed minded, overly pragmatic, unwilling to see things in a different way, stubborn or defensive, it is difficult to be surprised by God and stretched. We need to be less guarded, self-assured, and self-absorbed. God cannot break into the ordinary moments of our lives and inspire us when we cling to doubt. If we are going to discover resurrection faith, we have to believe that what the witnesses say is true, especially when they are credible. We also have to trust that the risen Christ is alive in us, too!

While the first witnesses to the resurrection have faded into history, there are many others who have come after them. They continue to inspire by walking the talk of faith. They are the martyrs who offer their lives for the Gospel, the simple holy people in our communities who cling so steadfastly to their faith, those who have touched despair and found new hope and the ones who, even in spite of ridicule, still pursue their hunger and thirst for God. They are our friends, acquaintances, biblical heroes, and saints, and many others who are convinced that they have seen the Lord! The risen Christ may not surprise us with the same kind of visit as he did the first disciples, but God finds other ways. All we have to do is open our eyes, remove whatever is preventing us from seeing and believing and exclaim: "My Lord and my God!" ©LPi
