

My thanks to everyone who helped to make our St. Joseph's Table and weekend celebration on March 18th & 19th a success. I am grateful to our team who helped to execute our special Mass on Saturday as well as the luncheon that followed. It was wonderful to connect the tradition of Italian food and community and join it to the celebration of the Mass.

Secondly, we were immensely grateful for the numerous people who donated various goods for our bake sale. This year, we decided to join our St. Joseph's effort to charity, and I am proud to say that we raised approximately \$2,500 dollars. I would estimate that we sold over 700 items. So along with our team, many dozens upon dozens of parishioners, neighbors, and leaders came together to support our brothers and sisters in need here in Chicago.



As a reminder, we raised money on behalf of Catholic Charities, especially the fund established for refugees and exiles. Many of them, coming from the southern border, are being supported in a variety of ways by our Catholic parishes in the Archdiocese. Because of your help, we can join our efforts with our sister parishes in serving those in need.

St. Joseph, who is the patron of fathers, workers, immigrants, refugees, and exiles, was the perfect occasion to celebrate what is good in our community and to reach out in the ways that we could. I am so immensely proud of the work that so many people did in support of this effort.

We also celebrated the *Feast of the Annunciation of Mary* with a special Mass on March 25th. She likewise is the Mother of the oppressed, but also our Lady of Charity. These past few weeks have served as wonderful expressions of our faith.

We now enter into the mysteries of Holy Week this *Palm Sunday*. Everything in our Faith is contained in the *Sacred Triduum*. Every celebration at Mass, from *Christmas* to *All Saints*, can be expressed in the power of this coming week.

I would encourage every member of this community to participate in these once-a-year liturgies. I genuinely believe that experiencing the fullness of *Holy Thursday*, *Good Friday*, and the *Easter Vigil* allows one to enter into the drama, the mystery, and the majesty of what we celebrate every Sunday. It is truly a special experience.

Thank you to all for your support of our parish, and please consider your *Easter* gift to our parish this year. We have increased our service and ministry efforts with more to come (which we are currently building timelines and strategies for through our various Councils.) Your continued support allows us to move forward and improve our community, little by little.

To IC's faithful supporters of Music Ministry,

The *Triduum* and *Easter Sunday* are almost upon us. It is hard to believe that we are already past the Fifth Week of Lent, with *Palm Sunday* greeting us as Jesus makes his triumphant procession into Jerusalem. Your generous support of our Music Ministry program allows us to enhance these special liturgies with guest musicians, whether they be vocalists or instrumentalists. I can tell you from personal experience that many parishioners approach me after Easter to comment on the high quality of our Holy Week liturgies.

This year, we will feature our professional vocal quintet, violin, guitar, and string bass on Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Our Easter Vigil as well as all of our Easter Sunday Masses will be adorned with violins, viola, two cellos, string bass, guitar, oboe, and timpani, with our vocal sextet leading us in song. We will indeed be making a joyful noise unto the Lord! At the Vigil and on Easter Sunday, be certain to have number 733 in your Breaking Bread hymnal queued up for two verses of "Crown Him With Many Crowns", which falls in the middle of our post-Communion Anthem. Our resident violinist, John Eckhardt, will be featured in a Vivaldi Violin Concerto offered to the congregation as a part of the prelude, mediation at Preparation of Gifts, and postlude.

All of this is only possible because of your amazing generosity! While we no longer take up a special collection at Easter for music, your monthly offertory envelope packets do contain a Music Ministry envelope. If you do not normally give monthly for music, I humbly ask you to consider using your envelope at Easter or to give online to Music Ministry through Give Central. Even if it is a one-time donation for the year, it will help make a difference in defraying the cost of these special guests during the most holy time of our liturgical year.


## Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, "The master has need of it," they let them take it. Of course, Jesus knew they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important

animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, "The master has need of it." And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it. — Father John Muir ©LPi

## Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Pedro Calungsod

Saint Pedro Calungsod was born around the year 1654 in the Philippines somewhere in the Visayan Islands. He was martyred at age 17 alongside Blessed Diego Luis de San Vitores while on mission in Guam and is recognized as the patron saint of Filipino youth.

Early in life, Pedro developed a vibrant and devout faith. He was educated as a catechist and volunteered to accompany Jesuit missionaries to Guam. At age 14 he was chosen alongside other exemplary young catechists to do just that, and he accompanied Spanish Jesuit missionary Diego Luis de San Vitroes to the islands. This Jesuit mission

was funded by Maria Ana of Austria, Queen Regent of Spain and was dedicated to the Virgin Mary. During this time in history, the island chain that Guam is associated with would come to be known as the Marianas Islands after the influential Spanish queen. Calungsod's mission, alongside his fellow missionaries, was to catechize those native to the island of Guam — specifically the Chamorro people.

During his missionary efforts, many people were baptized and joined the Christian faith. In a short period of time, Calungsod learned Spanish and developed relationships with the local people, helping to catechize many villages despite harsh conditions, an island territory sometimes difficult to navigate, and often a lack of supplies. It was in 1672 in the village of Tumon when he and San Vitores really ran into trouble.

While in Tumon, an immigrant man from China named Choco who was exiled to Guam due to his criminal acts in Manilla, began to spread rumors among the native peoples. He claimed that the baptismal water used by the missionaries was poisonous and the reason that some sickly infants in the village died. This rumor sank its teeth into the population and, encouraged by the local religious leaders whose power was threatened by the men's missionary work, it inspired intense persecution of the missionaries. Despite this, Calungsod and San Vitores answered the request of the Christian wife of Tumon's chief — Chief Matapang — to baptize their children.

Chief Matapang, believing the rumors started by the exiled man Choco, forbade the baptism and conversation to Catholicism. At his wife's request the missionaries went ahead and still baptized their children while he was out of the house. This enraged the chief and roused him to enlist some fellow villagers to violently attack and kill both Calungsod and San Vitores. It is said that at one point during the attack, Calungsod had a chance to escape but, instead, he did his best to help defend his friend San Vitores and they both perished. Following their deaths Chief Matapang tied them to large boulders and dumped their bodies into the water at Tumon Bay.

Pope John Paul II approved the martyrdom and beatification of St. Calungsod on December 19, 2011, and Pope Benedict canonized him on October 21, 2021, on world Mission Sunday, 340 years after his death. Pope John Paul II hoped that the young martyr's cause for sainthood would be an inspiration to young people everywhere. ©LPi
