

Stewardship: A Look At The Months Ahead...

In the past months, you have no doubt seen the progress we have made on some visible projects, namely the flooring project in our school (abating the asbestos and installing brand new floors) and the new garden project in front of our church (*featured on this weekend's bulletin cover*.)

These projects are made possible by a few factors: the needs and priorities of our campus, the generosity of our parishioners through regular giving, the availability of funds, as well as the available workforce at hand.

With your support, the changes we have made during these past few years, including a capital campaign to renovate the sound system of our church and our smaller scale 60th Anniversary campaign (*60 for 60*), have allowed us to accomplish many things.

As you may have noticed, however, most of these changes are in relation to deferred maintenance, necessary upgrades, changes for health and safety reasons, as well as for the long-term health of our physical campus.

These projects, while necessary and good in their own ways, are only a part of what my vision for the parish can be. In the meantime, we have also made improvements to what we offer to our parish community: our *Alpha* program, entirely volunteer run, has involved over 100 parishioners in faith sharing and personal growth; our *Connect* Program, growing to over 40 strong per month, focused on continued growth, education, and leadership training; while new and varied hospitality offerings engage our new families and current parishioners.

I have invested our resources in these and other groups because I believe in the process of leadership growth through a personal relationship with Christ, first and foremost, and thereafter building a stable community.

As we look to the future, I also must take careful stock of our resources. Investing in liturgy, people, and our campus requires prudent use of the money we have, and the sacrifices people make.

I believe Immaculate Conception is primed to move to the next level, but in order to do that, I would like to spend these next few months providing you with an overview of my vision for the future, how we make the present work, and our asking you to prayerfully consider your personal commitment to the parish in light of the future.

Please know that we never take for granted the generosity you have shown us these past few years. We likewise have been encouraged by the gradual growth of our numbers over time. At the same time, as I have preached before, engagement is just as important, if not *more* important, than mere numbers.

I hope that what I communicate these next few months is a sign of the positive steps that we have made, and a potential roadmap to our future.

During this time, we will also be updating our website, social media, and bulletin with information you can consider in your own time.







Sacramental Programs:



**Immaculate Conception Parish Policy states that students must attend Religious Education classes in Grades One and Two to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion in Grade Two.

All students are expected to continue to attend Religious Education classes to enroll in the Confirmation Program and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in Grade Eight.

All course requirements must be met. Regular attendance is expected.

2023-2024 Religious Education Tuition:

[Tuition fee includes all books and class materials and instruction by IC School Teachers] One student per family (Grades 1-7): \$400 One student (Grade 8) (classes end on December 13th): \$200 (*plus* Confirmation fee of \$50) Tuition increases by \$150 per additional child Confirmation fee (Grade 8): \$50 Communion fee (Grade 2): \$50 Registration fee (*for first time families only*): \$50 Late fee (*after Friday, September 15th*): \$100 Annual tuition payment due by: Friday, September 8th


Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture


A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "*Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?*" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but

rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust *He* is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on Him. And if we sink, He will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure. – *Father John Muir* ©LPi

(Practicing) Catholic: Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments...

God and the Good Strong Wind...

My only real memory of the Mackinac Island ferry was the physical sensation of the wind against my face. I remember, distinctly, that it hurt.

It surprised and confused me because wind had never felt painful before. Looking back now, I realize that it wasn't just the wind but the spray from the waves that crashed against the side of the ferry — that was what produced the sharp, biting sensation on my

skin. But I couldn't have known that then, because my eyes were clamped shut. I refused to open them, even if I had, I would not have seen much, because my long hair was blown straight across my face.

I was four years old, and it was, in the immortal words of Winnie-the-Pooh, a very blustery day as my family made our way to Mackinac Island. I remember thinking I was going to die. I'm positive now that it wasn't really all that dramatic, but at four years old, you're awfully scared of a good strong wind. Deep inside, aren't we all, really?

I think of the apostles who cannot recognize Christ — their friend — because he is doing something new. Something impossible. They are so sure he is a ghost, a sinister thing — children are always frightened of what they cannot understand.

And even when he reassures them, still Peter is not convinced. He demands, essentially, a miracle. He demands that Christ make him do what only Christ can do.

And even when the miracle takes place — he walks on water, he defies physics — still he is human. Scared, doubtful, distractible. No match for a good strong wind.
