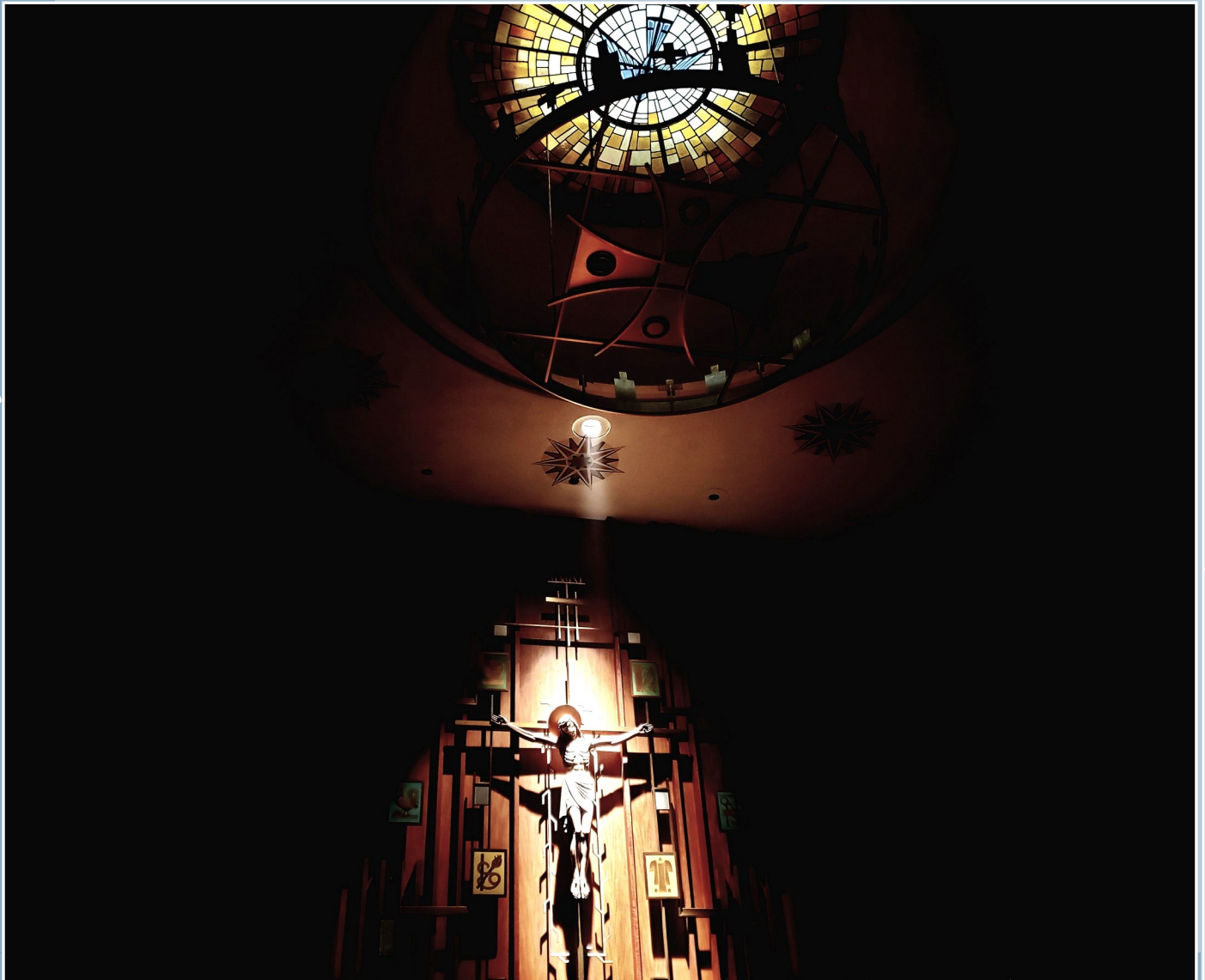

Divine Renovation Conference 2022

I was given an amazing opportunity to attend the Divine Renovation conference with Father Matt and Michael Tom.

The conference was hosted by St. Ann’s parish, which is a large parish of more than 8,000 families located in Coppell, Texas (everything in Texas is BIG). Each day started with a morning Mass attended by conference participants. It was a moving sight to see over one hundred priests processing in as they concelebrated Mass together. The pews were filled to capacity and the music was so beautiful and uplifting. Seeing and hearing all 650+ attendees sing, and worship together brought a feeling of joy and love to my heart. It was a wonderful way to start each day. Everyone was alive!

The conference, held over a 3-day period, provided the opportunity to meet and be around people with a passion for God and the Holy Spirit. Each day there was a choice of different breakout sessions offered on topics including: *leadership, mission, culture, and relationships*. General session and keynote speakers talked about why we need a vision, evangelization, the best of leadership and powers of the Holy Spirit.

Here is what I learned from the sessions that I attended:

1. Vision is a God-inspired picture of the future that produces passion in us. We need to unlock the picture of what the future looks like in order to produce passion.
2. Mission is especially important, but if maintenance is the primary purpose of a parish, you may never get to mission.
3. There are many barriers to inviting non-church goers to our parish which can easily be overcome if we are willing to step out of our comfort zone.
4. The Holy Spirit is the principal power of evangelization.
5. Parishes should strive for a healthy relationship with their diocese.
6. As disciples, we should go out and make other disciples and it should be intentional.
7. Leadership is about equipping and supporting others and requires PASSION.
8. Texas has the best barbecue (did I mention everything in Texas is BIG?).

It was wonderful to meet so many people from across the county who share the passion of discipleship and want to see their parishes come alive. I spoke to a number of individuals to learn about their journey and how it led to their passion and the role they play in their parish; and I answered questions about our Alpha program and shared the reasons why I got involved. It was wonderful to talk about faith in a comfortable and welcoming setting. On the last day of the conference, Bishop Edward Burns gave an uplifting but humorous homily reminding us to go and make disciples (and he was kind enough to take a picture with me afterward.)

As Father Matt focuses on growing the next generation of leaders at IC, we should all think about what role we can play in helping our parish come alive.

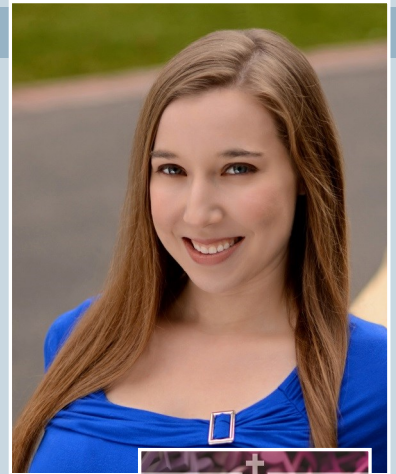
The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Monday, August 15th

Julie (Jarosz) Malecki is happy to be back at IC, where she grew up attending weekend Masses with her parents, grandparents, and siblings. Julie is an alumna of IC school who has been involved in the Music Ministry since third grade, when she joined the Choristers and Junior Ringers. She has since become a cantor, choir member, and member of the Overtones Handbell Choir, even directing the handbell ensemble for a few years, and remaining connected with the IC Music Ministry as much as possible while away at college and graduate school.

Julie is a classically-trained soprano and holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in vocal performance and literature from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. This is what the floors in our hallways looked like before scraping off the wax.



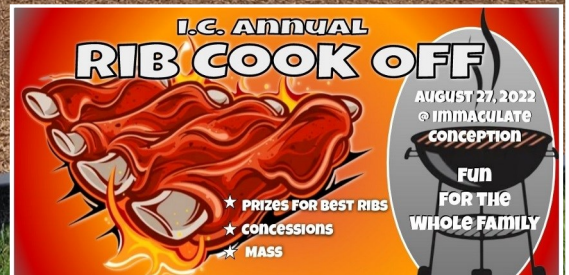
After one scraping, a noticeable difference can be seen!

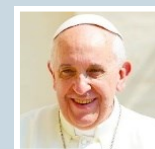

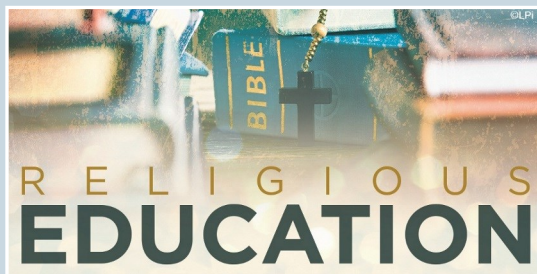

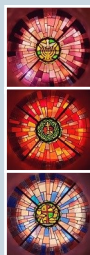

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



An inward transformation occurs in a person who decides to follow Jesus Christ. Things change. They see the world differently, understand their journey more deeply and profoundly, have their sights fixed on eternity and union with God and hold themselves to higher standards and virtues. It requires a conscious choice to be a Christian, and this choice must be renewed at least daily. While the basic premise of Jesus’ message may appear heartwarming and straightforward: love of God, neighbor, and self, the implications of doing so are challenging. The true disciple is called to live radically, and often finds themselves at odds with the world or even with those in their own homes.

Holding ourselves to higher standards comes with a price. We have to leave other things behind. It is difficult to be people of faith, hope, and love in a world often fixated with its own fulfillment and self-absorption. Justice, temperance, prudence, and fortitude require sacrifice if they are to be lived with integrity. God’s ways are not ours. This becomes crystal clear to those who have enough courage to stand against the tide. Putting love into action requires that we challenge accepted modes of doing business and fight complacency. This is what makes the saints stand out as witnesses. They are simply sinners, just like us, who persevere.

People do not want to be told that they’re sailing their ships in the wrong direction. Clinging to their insistence and need to be correct, they can become defensive when challenged. This can happen even with those closest to us. As much as the Gospel calls us to unity, it also can easily create division. When we love seriously, we encounter more than feelings of warmth and acceptance. *“What does love look like? It has the hands to help others. It has the feet to hasten to the poor and needy. It has eyes to see misery and want. It has the ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of men. That is what love looks like (St. Augustine).”* Love also has the courage and honesty to tell people what they may not want to hear but need to, and model, without wavering, a life of humble, loving, and faithful service. Don’t lose heart! There are many examples of faith before us and around us. If Jesus endured the voices of opposition, so too can we. There is no need to apologize for speaking the truth. ©LPi

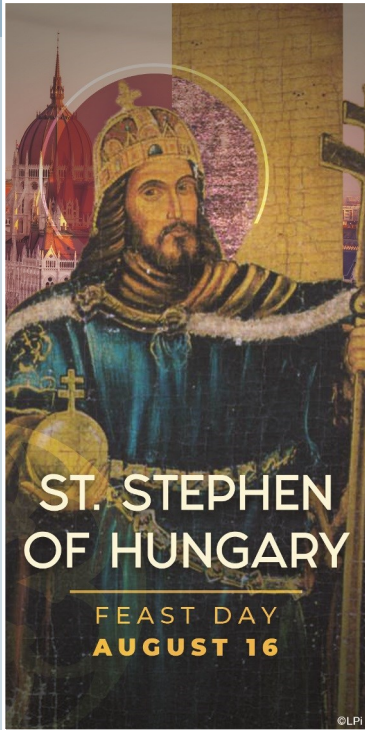

Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Stephen of Hungary (August 16th)

Born a pagan in the 10th century, Saint Stephen was baptized as a boy when his father converted to Christianity. Saint Stephen married Gisela, daughter of Duke Henry II of Bavaria who would become Saint Henry II. He succeeded his father as leader and began to transform the nation into a Christian kingdom.

Pope Sylvester II proclaimed him the first king of Hungary in 1001, sending him a crown and gold processional cross. The crown, made in the Byzantine style, has become a symbol of Hungarian nationhood.

King Stephen's reign was a relatively peaceful and prosperous time. He outlawed paganism, mandated church building, and tithing for support of the parish, and commanded all to marry except clergy and religious. He founded a Benedictine monastery, and Hungary became an important place along the route to the Holy Land for many pilgrims.

Unfortunately, Stephen's son and heir died in a hunting accident, causing much conflict over the succession when the saint died. Eventually, the kingdom was won back for Christendom and father and son were canonized in 1083 by Pope St. Gregory VII. Saint Stephen I is now patron saint of Hungary. ©LPI
