

Special Collections @ IC: Maintenance, Music & Hospitality...

Dear all,

Last week's article was the preface to the following few months where I would like to discuss various things pertaining to stewardship and giving. My vision is not simply financial stability which, for many parishes, is simply breaking even. It is, rather, striving to improve our overall collection so that we can expand our efforts without playing catch-up every time. For that purpose, I would like to highlight a few special collections below which some of you may be aware, namely: Maintenance, Music, and Hospitality.



Our *Maintenance* collection, marked by a green envelope in your monthly packet, covers a variety of projects and needs. Such things include our landscaping and care for our campus, which benefits both school and church. It also affords us the ability to act on small projects, such as painting our church restrooms. These funds also allow us the freedom to purchase replacement parts for machinery or varied items needed in our

> While this fund does not completely cover the cost of all maintenance, it helps to supplement our operational costs as well as more aggressively pursue upgrades and cosmetic changes. 
> Our *Music Ministry* collection, marked by a gray envelope, goes directly towards supplementing our guest instrumentalists, ensembles for Holy Days, and even our weekly cantors who elevate our music during Mass.

Scott and I strive to bring the highest quality to all parts of our weekend liturgies as we view regular Sunday worship as the high point of our community's prayer. As such, we dedicate resources to elevate that prayer for everyone who comes to worship with us, parishioner and guest alike. With that said, beautiful liturgies do come at a monetary cost, which is supplemented by our Music Ministry Fund. If you have been moved by our music on Holy Days or any given Sunday, or if you have visited places where music and audio is sometimes an afterthought, I believe you can agree that our Music Program offers top quality service to our community.

(givecentral.org/location/349/event/17649) 2022 was a challenging year for us as inflation and the overall state of the economy left our Music Ministry in a slight deficit position compared to our fiscal year budget. If you consider yourself a patron of the arts, perhaps you might consider an offering to Music Ministry. Even giving something as simple as \$5 dollars a month would be tremendous. For those of you already contributing, we thank you for your continued generosity!

One of our newest special collections, *Hospitality* encompasses several events and efforts that are new or modified here at IC. Coffee House (1st Sundays), New Parishioner Breakfasts (Quarterly), and Family Masses all benefit from our newly formed Hospitality Line. Special events and food services associated with our Masses, Alpha, ministry training, and Seminarian formation are contained under hospitality as well. Hospitality is not just how we welcome guests, but how we treat each other, strengthening our relationships by spending that extra time to grow and pray with one another.





All students are expected to continue to attend Religious Education classes to enroll in the Confirmation Program and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in Grade Eight.


All course requirements must be met. Regular attendance is expected.

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



The suffering of a child symbolizes uniquely terrible evil as well as despair about the future. This week's Gospel gives a "*limit*" case in which Jesus encounters this evil in the form of a mother with a suffering daughter. What he does is stunning and massively helpful for us if we bravely ponder the details.

The Canaanite woman comes to Jesus and begs his mercy. "*My daughter is tormented by a demon*," she declares to him. Shockingly, he responds first with silence, then with a dismissive comment, and only then finally accedes to her third request. Is this simply a lesson in perseverance in our petitions to God, who is like a genie in a bottle? Does that justify the humiliation and pain this woman suffers? Is the Lord cruel?

I don't think so. Notice how the encounter ends. She compares herself to a dog at the table of a master. Jesus responds by praising her great faith and fulfills her deep desire. Somehow this non-Israelite woman intuits that this harrowing situation is not dumb suffering. She senses that the door of God's family is, in Jesus, being opened to her and her loved ones. She trusts she is at the Lord's table, and her desires will be fulfilled and that all her sufferings — and her daughter's, too — will lead a great banquet. In our sufferings this week, the Lord wants us to treat him less like a genie in a bottle and more like the Master who has taken us — lost little dogs that we are — into his home forever. Trust that and keep praying in the face of evil. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi
