60 For 60 Fundraiser

The past few years have seen a transformation of our campus. While there is still much more to do, both school and parish alike, we approached the immensity of the task gradually. In doing so, a great deal of deferred maintenance has been addressed, improvements have been made, and quality of life projects have been accomplished within the span of five years.



All of these projects serve the Kingdom of God, albeit in an ancillary way. The health and beauty of our campus is important because deferred maintenance and poor stewardship can easily waste money, makes our campus appear uninviting, and ultimately projects the wrong message of how we feel about worship. In many ways, the final point is the most important: how do we project our priorities. If God is at the center of our lives, does it do us any good to have a neglected church?

This is all said, however, with full mind of the words of Scripture and of many saints: appearance is not the proof of devotion, but actions are. Having a beautiful church and campus are not the final say in faith or devotion, but I believe they encourage and are conducive to them.

That, then, is the purpose of our *60 for 60 Campaign*. We are raising \$60,000 dollars to celebrate 60 years of Masses and Sacraments celebrated by our community at IC. The project seeks to beautify elements of our Mass and history itself. The focus of our project is: (1) acquiring a new piano for our church, (2) replating the brass candles and tabernacle, (3) reupholstering the kneelers and chairs in our sanctuary, and (4) beautifying the greenspace in front of our school on Talcott.

Number (4) represents a part of our history as the oldest part of our campus still surviving – one hundred years in 2024. The brass and kneelers, mostly, have been with us since 1962, and the piano has been with us many decades and is nearing the end of its life.

Next weekend, we will have special envelopes and pledge cards for your donations – you may turn in a pledge card with contact information for us to follow up or submit a donation directly. I have also designed a booklet to give you a specific scope of each project as well as a brief history.

The campaign will run from August 27th to December 8th, concluding on our church's 60th Anniversary which will be celebrated by Bishop Bartosic. If you would like to make any private inquiries or donations, please contact Vince (our *Director of Operations*) or myself. (Our contact information can be found on page 10 of our bulletin).

On our YouTube Channel, found on the main page of our website (icchicago.org), I have edited together a brief history of Immaculate Conception, 1904 – present, for you to enjoy. We have other video projects planned, so I hope you can support IC by increasing our social media presence as well.

In all, thank you everyone for your immense support. By helping us improve and beautify IC, you are allowing us this year to expand Alpha, begin a Connect Group, begin to branch out new service offerings, train leaders and disciples, and draw new people to the Gospel. Little by little, our actions will more impactfully mirror our appearance and our worship will inspire our work. May God bless us, our projects, and our building the Kingdom in Norwood Park.

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



The serious disciple knows the necessity and value of discipline. Thinking of discipline as something punitive in nature, we underscore its place in our spiritual lives. Discipline is really about a radical trust in God and His guidance. *“When you are conducted by a guide who takes you through an unknown country at night across fields where there are no tracks, by his own skill, asking no advice from anyone, giving no inkling of his plans, what choice do you have but to give yourself completely to his guidance? If you are convinced that he is a good guide, you must have faith in him and abandon yourself to his care (Jean-Pierre de Caussade).”*

If someone wants to be physically fit, they readily find a competent trainer who sets them on a rigorous schedule. Determined to reach their goals, they sacrifice personal pleasure and trust in his guidance. Why should it be any different with God? In order to remain true to the way Jesus places before us, we have to listen, learn, and be willing to change. Falling in love with God and maintaining that relationship requires an investment of time, energy, and hard work. Putting personal preferences aside in pursuit of the Gospel and giving proper attention to our spiritual lives is challenging work. At first, *“all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it (Hebrews).”*

“What God does is essentially good. It does not need to be reformed or controlled...If you would live according to the Gospels, give yourself completely and simply to the action of God (Jean-Pierre de Caussade).” Submission to the holy will of God is not a submission to a set of pre-ordained set of circumstances. Rather, it is an abandonment and trust in God’s creative, life-giving, and salvific power. God brings light out of darkness and life out of death. Nurturing this bond of trust and seeking God in all things creates an intimate and particular relationship and bond between our Creator and us. When He comes, there will be no issue with us recognizing Him or Him recognizing us. We will have met before. ©LPi

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained: Gratitude

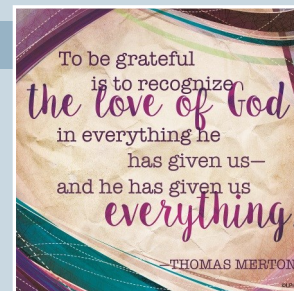
Question:

How can I practice gratitude in my everyday life?

Answer:

God has given each of us many blessings. Fostering an *“attitude of gratitude”* might be easier than you think. Simple, concrete practices can help us to be more thankful more often. Incorporate it into your dinner with your spouse, or as you tuck the kids into bed at night. *“What are three things you’re thankful for today?”* Make a habit of writing one note a week to someone special in your life, thanking them for how they’ve impacted you. This is also a good practice in the workplace. Consider opening your weekly meetings with a quick round of gratitude sharing. *“I’m grateful John helped me with that last-minute change to my presentation last week. I wouldn’t have finished it in time for the meeting without him.”*

Another way is to designate a few minutes to thank God. This could be the first bit of your daily prayer time or after you receive communion on Sundays. You can also integrate it into your daily routine. How about while brushing your teeth? There’s probably nothing so important it can’t wait two minutes. Brush your teeth, quiet your mind, and thank God from your heart for His blessings throughout the day. Get creative! Any moment is an opportunity to praise and thank God. ©LPi

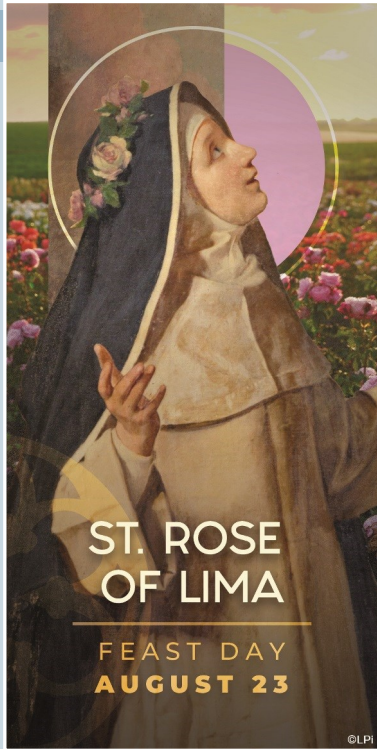

Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Rose of Lima (August 23rd)

Born Isabel Flores de Olivia in April 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonists, Saint Rose of Lima took the name Rose at her confirmation in 1597. Legend holds that she received this nickname as an infant because a servant saw her face transformed into a rose.

Even as a child Saint Rose was dedicated to Christ. Growing up she made many secret penances. And when she was old enough to be married, deterred suitors by cutting off her hair and rubbing pepper on face to make it blister. She took a vow of chastity even though her parents wished her to marry. She fasted many times a week and permanently abstained from meat.

Eventually her parents gave in and allowed her to join the Third Order of St. Dominic, although she was not permitted to live in a convent. Saint Rose undertook severe penances, allowing herself only two hours of sleep a night in order to have more time to pray, wearing a heavy silver crown with spikes on the inside imitating Christ's crown of thorns, and even burning her own hands. However, she also cared for the sick and hungry, and sold her beautiful embroidery and fine lace, as well as flowers she grew to help raise funds for the poor.

She died at the age of 31 on August 24, 1617. Pope Clement X canonized her in 1671, she was the first saint of the New World, born in the Americas. Saint Rose of Lima is the patron saint of Latin America and the Philippines. ©LPi
