The Priorities Of The New Year: Leadership & Hospitality

Welcome back to all of our families! It was wonderful to see our children back this week, especially many of them seeing their new classrooms. The new floors and resurfaced parking lot helped to emphasize the newness of this year. My prayers are for our new and returning teachers, likewise for our students and families—a special welcome to all of our first-time parents at IC!



Throughout the year, we will be offering a variety of opportunities for community and for personal and spiritual growth. Allow me to list them in short form:

<u>Alpha</u> – Our flagship program, Alpha is a program which centers around a meal, a reflection, and open discussions. It starts with the premise, "Who is Jesus to me?" Already, nearly 70 parishioners have participated, and all team leaders are members of our parish family. The program is open to everyone, is free of charge (meals, retreat, etc.), and of excellent value. This Fall, participants will now have the option of either attending on Saturday mornings (beginning on September 17th) or on Monday evenings (beginning on September 19th.) <u>Coffeehouse</u> – A new Hospitality offering that will take place, essentially, on the first Sunday of every month beginning on October 2nd. It will be an open-forum experience hosted by various parish groups. Coffee and light foods will be provided, along with a space for everyone to gather together and enjoy. It will be open after our 8:30 A.M. Mass through Noon. We hope it is a good opportunity to meet leaders and neighbors alike! Freewill offerings will be accepted.


<u>Fruitful Harvest</u> - Returning for a second year, Fruitful Harvest is a reflection series taking place, typically, on the last Sunday of the month. Assisted by our seminarians and leaders in our parish, we lead a roundtable reflection on varied topics with small group discussion afterward. Light food will be provided. Join us for these faith-sharing exercises!

Lastly, I will be emphasizing prayer more at our parish. One such way, is through *The Liturgy of the Hours*. A Reflection On The Subject Of Prayer: The Liturgy Of The Hours

I would like to introduce you to a new form of daily prayer called: *The Liturgy of the Hours*. It is published by the *'Word on Fire Institute'* and it arrives in the mail every month when you subscribe at: *wordonfire.org/pray*

In essence, this is the traditional Church prayer recited daily by all clergy and religious worldwide. The contents are taken from the Sacred Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, and it makes wide use of the psalms and other classic passages. If you already enjoy prayer, this experience will dramatically expand the content of your daily prayer life, even if it only adds no more than a half hour total to your daily time for prayer, which is split into three sections: Morning, Evening and Night.



What is captivating is that you will walk through the story of Salvation hand in hand with the Prophets, the Kings, and the inspired writers as they recount in vivid colors the Might, the Wonders and the Great Mercy of our God, as He looks after His people, defending them, teaching them, and forgiving them for the numerous times they falter. Our own humanity is also on full display in the cry of the sinner, in his redemptive repentance, and finally, trusting in a merciful God that forgets His Justice when called by a contrite heart. What is awe-inspiring for me, is to witness the eternal plans of salvation from way back, as the Father prepares for the coming of His Son Jesus.

If you have been getting comfortable with prayer, but often you seem to run out of time, then step into a more organized form—it will be a joyful oasis you will look forward to. - *Mario Orrico*





























Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



People who are concerned with their own advancement and agenda have little room for anyone else. With an almost addictive pursuit of esteem and acknowledgment from others, they become little more than entitled embodiments of the vice of pride. Public humiliation or embarrassment can hit them hard. While avoiding humiliation and embarrassment may be advantageous to obtaining worldly success, they are much less desirable motivations for entering the Kingdom of God. Avoiding embarrassment is a self-serving motivation. Pride and all of its manifestations have no place on God's agenda, neither do worldly success and fulfillment. In fact, we have

been clearly told that if we love our lives, we will lose them. Therefore, if you really want to find your true station in life, learn to give yourself away.

While this may sound foolish to secular ears, it actually makes perfect sense. God, who is love, makes each of us in His image. Love, and therefore God, is in our DNA. That being the case, love is never love if it is kept to oneself or hoarded. Love needs to be shared and given away. Therefore, it is the only proper motivation for entering the Kingdom of God. The door to happiness is only opened when we realize that all we are and all we have is due only to God's grace. Without God we are nothing.

Love is the remedy for pride and protects us from ourselves. God asks us to be humble. Only when we are free from the traps of pride and arrogance that we can begin to follow the path to true humility. Only one who is humble can rightly love and be of service to God. "God makes use only of the humble as his instruments (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." The humble one does not need others to give them worth and value. Their self-esteem comes from the much more secure foundation of God. Only those who are entirely free can give themselves freely to others. Love must always be our motivation for doing all things. Be content that God has invited you to the banquet of life. Concern yourself with accepting the invitation, and don't worry about where you will sit. ©LPi

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained: Sign Before The Gospel

Question: I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?

Answer: Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel. ©LPi



Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Gregory The Great (September 3^{rd})

Saint Gregory the Great lived in a most turbulent time. There were devastating episodes of plague, the sacking of Rome and the breakdown of strong Roman rule, invasions by Lombards and Franks, floods, and a widening gap between imperial Byzantium and the Roman Church.

Born around 540 into a noble Roman family, Saint Gregory was probably trained in law, and started his public service as a Prefect of Rome. However, upon the death of his father, he converted his family home to a monastery, where he resided as a monk. He built six more monasteries in Sicily and one in Rome.

Often called the father of the medieval papacy and Apostle of the English, Saint Gregory was proclaimed Pope by acclamation in 590. Although he was reluctant to assume this post, preferring the cloistered life, his accomplishments were many. He was an extremely capable manager of Church estates and tenants and is known for his reform of the liturgy. He was instrumental in the consolidation of papal power and led the fight against the many heresies promoted by small Christian groups at the time. Through his prolific correspondence he oversaw monastic life, curtailing the power of grasping bishops, correcting abuses, and enforcing discipline. He was particularly concerned with the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his monastery including Saint Augustine of Canterbury to evangelize there.

Saint Gregory died in 604 and was sainted immediately. He is one of four key doctors of the Western Church, including Saints Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome. **©LPi**
