Ways We Are Improving At IC

In this same bulletin, one of our parishioners, Michael Tom, composed an article on Leadership and Empowerment.

While I will allow his words to speak for themselves, I can write a little from my perspective as to how I hope to grow our parish and empower our leadership:

Transformative Weekend Experience:

You may have heard this mentioned here and there as this is one of our core values at our parish. Many elements make up a 'weekend experience' such as music, homilies, the cleanliness of our church, and the friendliness of people in our building.

Ultimately, God is at the center of who we are — let alone what we do. We have spent a great deal of time improving our campus (installed new carpet, new kneelers, new sound system, new roof, repaired our ceiling, and hired landscapers to care for our campus' lawn and garden, etc.). The 'cosmetic' side of everything is important. Being clean, clear, and professional is our gift to God—i.e., how we regard our worship space—and also how we respect you, our parishioner and/or guest. Your presence is important to us. In joining us here at IC, you are a part of our community and family.

Beyond these cosmetic aspects are the 'people' side of things. I will be working with Scott, Mary, and Darlene to further improve our weekend hospitality. My hope is to expand and empower our weekend ushers/greeters to help me and others meet new people and allow them to feel at home more readily. I thank Mary Dosek for taking on more efforts to help me organize events for our parishioners and Darlene Mroz, likewise, for her dedication in organizing and growing all those who help us.

Alpha and Connect:


Connect is born from Alpha — it is meant to be the next step for those who have participated. While we are expanding our Alpha program, we are also building something new. Connect is for Alpha alumni only and it is also meant to accomplish three things: (1) connect parishioners from different years and small groups together, (2) keep the small groups that form together, and (3) allow parishioners to see their gifts and talents connected to the mission of Christ.

In Alpha, I will be empowering our long-standing leaders to train our next leaders. It will be a new thing for them to learn how to create new leaders—it can be hard enough to be a leader ourselves, but they have grown so much these past three years. It is an amazing group of parishioners and people.

Connect, likewise, will also work with people on how to witness to their faith. Evangelization is not only specific conversations about Christ or Church, but also how comfortable we are to talk about faith in its many influences. I look forward to growing the next generation of leaders at our parish. It is only through them that our parish will grow, and I am encouraged by the people who are stepping forward, prompted by God's love. - Fr. Matt

Divine Renovation Conference 2022

First of all, I want to thank Fr. Matt for inviting me to attend the DR Conference. It was, in a word, amazing! Secondly, I want to thank you, my brothers and sisters, for supporting us financially and spiritually. Without you, none of this is possible.

I am always refreshed when I attend conferences such as these because I get a chance to meet other people from around the world engaging in the very efforts that we are. It is encouraging to meet other parishes that are three steps ahead of us, and rewarding to support and encourage parishes that are three steps behind. In thinking about this, I am reminded that renewal of Immaculate Conception is a transformative process, and that we are in the beginning stages of renewal.

My takeaways from the Conference were: *Vision, Empowerment* and *Leadership*.



Vision

Fr. James Mallon (DR) opened the Conference with a wonderful keynote address about Vision. If you do not have a vision, then where is it that you are hoping to go? Without vision, wherever you are, you are already there. So, what is our vision for IC? What is my vision for IC?

I want to encourage you, my brothers and sisters, to spend some quiet time in prayer, in Adoration, to ponder and pray about your vision for IC. When your vision comes into focus, draw it out. Commit it to a sketch and hang it on your refrigerator. When you are ready, share it with us. I will arrange a Vision Sharing Event and we will discuss how the Holy Spirit has inspired/led us to create our specific visions for IC.

Empowerment

When I agreed to launch Alpha at the request of Fr. Robert Fedek, I remember him "empowering" me to launch Alpha. Admittedly, I really did not understand what he was referring to. Secularly, when we are empowered, we are given the authority to accomplish the task at hand. How well we fail or succeed is entirely dependent upon the effort that we put forth. If it works, we take the credit, and if it fails, we take the blame. There is no one else. But when we are empowered by the Holy Spirit, the concept of empowerment takes on a new definition. What appears to be impossible by human effort is now made possible by the Divine. The Conference reinforced this point many times over. We are *empowered* by the Holy Spirit.

It is at this point in the Conference when things really took off. The mental burdens that I had been carrying for a while were suddenly lifted as I came to the realization that I was not in the game alone. Parishes from all over the world are doing the exact same thing as we are, and the Holy Spirit was with us the entire time. He still is.

Leadership

"Success in Leadership is not defined in the number of people who follow, but by the number of Leaders raised." The difference between Management and Leadership can be seen in the standard workflow chart. We are all familiar with the pyramid graph which shows the "boss" at the top and the connections as they cascade below. This is your standard management chart. The Leadership chart is just the opposite. Instead of identifying those below, you support those above. You want to raise up leaders because engaging in Mission is not a one man show. In fact, it is nearly impossible.

When I returned home, one of my first priorities was to meet with our Alpha Team. I wanted to pray with them, to empower them with the Holy Spirit, and to encourage them to be Leaders of Immaculate Conception. I want them to have their own vision, and I wanted to empower them with the Holy Spirit so that they can pursue their vision of IC. I want them to move on from Alpha, so that the next wave of Leaders can step forth and take their place.

Final Thoughts

On Saturday, August 27th, IC will be hosting our annual Back to School Night/Rib Cook-Off. This is a perfect opportunity for you to invite a friend to IC, to hang out, relax and enjoy each other's company. If prompted by the Holy Spirit, invite them to attend Alpha with you. (Our Fall session begins in September.) Alpha representatives will be on hand to answer any questions that you may have. And if you want to engage in the Rib Cook-off, even better! (Please visit the Parish Office to sign up for the Rib Cook-Off event.)

"En Prière" (In Prayer)



Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture





Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Jane Frances de Chantal (August 12th)

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal was born to a noble family in Dijon, France, on January 28, 1572. Her mother died when she was an infant. Her father raised her and provided for her education. In 1592, she married the Baron de Chantal, the couple were devoted to each other. They had six children, three of whom died in infancy. As Baroness, Saint Jane Frances restored the custom of daily Mass, and was famous for her charitable works. Unfortunately, her husband died in a hunting accident only eight years after their marriage. Devastated, Jane Frances was forced to live in her father-in-law's strict household where she took a vow of chastity.

In 1604 while visiting her father in Dijon, she met Saint Francis de Sales and he became her close friend and spiritual director. Although not many of their epistles have survived, the pair had a lively correspondence which lasted until Saint Francis died.

Under the direction of St. Francis de Sales and with his partnership she established the Congregation of the Visitation at Annecy in 1610. This was a unique order, without the extreme ascetical practices typical in other religious orders, accepting women and girls and those rejected by other orders because of poor health or age. The new order was also unusual in its public ministry, rather than a strictly cloistered life. Saint Jane transformed her convent at Annecy into a hospital during the plague of 1628.

The saint died at the Visitation Convent in Moulins on December 13, 1641. At the time of her death, there were 86 convents of Visitation nuns. She was canonized in 1767 by Pope Clement XIII. ©LPi


