The Immaculate Conception...

The Blessed Virgin Mary has been honored and venerated since the beginning of the Church. While the Immaculate Conception, the dogma that states that Mary was conceived and born without sin, was declared in 1854, the entire world has named churches and places after her.



In the 8th century, St. John of Damascus wrote, "O marvel above all marvels! A woman has become higher than the seraphim since God has been seen *made a little less than the angels (Ps 8:6)*. Let the most wise Solomon be silent and let him not say, *There is nothing new under the sun (Ecc 1:9)*. O Virgin, full of divine grace, holy temple of God which the Spiritual Solomon, Prince of Peace, constructed and inhabited; you are not adorned with lifeless stones, but in place of gold you shine with the Spirit."

We also honor and bless the Virgin Mary with our liturgies. First, we always honor her when we honor her Son, Jesus, every day, and every Sunday. Mary, ever a disciple, always leads others to the love and mercy of her son. Secondly, we honor her on her Feast Days, especially the Immaculate Conception which we celebrated on the 8th. Thirdly, we celebrate her and the Holy Family on Christmas, the Octave, and the Christmas season. Lastly, we offer honor to her during our Vespers services and other prayers (such as morning rosary at daily Mass).

I hope you were able to celebrate with us last week and will continue to honor Mary who is our guide and support.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank all of our volunteers who have helped us this year and who are helping us to decorate, clean, and coordinate this Advent and Christmas season. Thank you for allowing our own spiritual temple to be a welcoming place of worship and prayer.

We are also making a video for January in honor of Mary with the help of our seminarians. It is currently being filmed and edited, so I hope you enjoy the reflection that we are preparing for you.

Lastly, as we move through this Advent Season, I hope you are able to use the quiet moments of winter to step away from shopping, parties, and rushing around and simply be with God. The serene example of Mary reminds us that *rest* is just as essential as work. "*My soul, be at rest in God alone, from whom comes my hope. God alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not fall.*" (Ps 62:6-7).

May God give you peace and rest this Advent Season, and may the Blessed Virgin Mary pray for all of us, that we might grow closer to her Son and one another this special time of year.


Next Weekend @ IC: Family Mass

Oplatki (Christmas Wafers)

The breaking of the Christmas wafer is a custom that began in Poland in the 10th century. It is considered the most ancient and beloved of Polish traditions that expresses unity in the brokenness of the shared



wafer, as well as a link to the unbroken chain of Christ's own Body shared through the one Bread in His one Church. The sharing of the Christmas wafer also symbolized forgiveness and reconciliation, an essential key to unity. Our parish tradition of offering Oplatki to our community continues this year, now available at our Parish Office for \$3.00 (while supplies last.)

Fourth Grade Explores Norwood Park History

Our Fourth grade students took a walk to the oldest house in Chicago, the *Noble-Seymour-Crippen House*, right here in Norwood Park. This house is the home of the Norwood Park Historical Society, and is designated as a national landmark.



Our Fourth graders spent an hour in the house, beginning with receiving a

brief summary of the house's history, and its significance in the history of Norwood Park. Then, each student was given a question to answer as we toured the 190-year-old house. They looked at photos, artifacts and furnishings while the docent explained Norwood Park's transformation from farmland, to village, to becoming part of the city of Chicago. Our students enjoyed seeing old photos of the train station (with a steam locomotive) as well as the

Norwood Park hotel (late-1800s) and we were excited to find our school and the old white frame church on a 1949 aerial photograph of the area!

To wrap up our visit, each student shared the fact that they found to answer the question they had been given at the start of our adventure. We enjoyed our visit and learned a lot about our community!







Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained: Sharing Faith

Question: My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

Answer: There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you! ©*LPi*
