

December Catch-Up

I will be preaching about Evangelization and Alpha at all of our Masses this weekend (December 12th & 13th), so I thought my article here would be a good opportunity to catch you up on some of the projects and plans of our parish.



1) Sound System

Our Sound System project has been, overall, a great success. Besides some tweaks and adjustments, we have already seen the benefit of clearer audio that reaches all corners of our Church. We have begun to implement our video system more regularly. We have livestreamed our 10:30 A.M. Masses and, with a full Church each weekend and many people watching from home, it has been a great experience. We have also streamed our first Funeral Masses, allowing families to be there for their loved ones, even at a distance. I am really proud of my staff's hard work to bring people together in-person and online. We will be adding Wi-Fi to our Church soon. While our new app has been delayed (which will allow you to have access to music and readings), it will come soon.

A big "Thank You" goes out to our **Holy Name Men's Club**, who helped wash our walls in our Vestibule, to **Vince Kennedy** and **Scott Will** for their leadership on this project, and to **Melissa Anna** for her work on livestreaming our Masses.

2) New Online Content

We have tried our best to provide new content online to engage our audience. Here are a few examples:

- More regular uploads of our music to YouTube and Facebook
- A new series which entails providing answers to our kid's questions on faith and life (which premiered on Dec. 9th), on Facebook, YouTube, and Twitch
- Our Advent Vespers, online on Twitch and Facebook (December 9th, 16th, & 23rd)
- Our **new website** is set to premiere on December 19th at our new domain name: **www.icchicago.org**

3) Renovations and Upgrades to our Parish Office

For too long our Parish Office has been neglected, so we have made use of this time to give a little TLC to the place where we work, where you visit, and where many of us will meet again. After renovating our Rectory Assembly last year, we shifted our focus towards improving our main office area.

We have already recarpeted our Parish Office and did significant cleaning. We are now in the planning stages of repainting the main area, resurfacing the island, and patching many spots. Other office rooms have already been fully repainted. Soon, my office will not only be a meeting space, but a little studio where the parish and I can create some new content for you.


New Chrome Books in Third Grade

Students in Mrs. Fritz's Third Grade Class were excited to receive brand new Chrome Books this week! The Chrome Books replace older version i-Pads that were previously being used. Third grade students use the Chrome Books to complete weekly i-Ready assessments, Google Classroom assignments and utilize a variety of other applications and websites on a daily basis. Our students use Chrome Books to engage in interactive assignments for Art Class, Music Class and classroom subject areas. Due to the inability to work in partners or groups this year, students can also work on virtual group projects, create video presentations and share evidence of learning in a variety of ways. Chrome Books will also be a key component of remote learning in January, allowing all of our students to connect with their teacher and classmates each day. Room 16 is grateful to Mrs. Olker for setting everything up so that they can connect easily and learn more efficiently!

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Did you ever stop and realize that there is no earthly gain that can ever really satisfy us? Think of winning the Lotto. On this side of the winning ticket, it's all about the money, the new car, house, vacations, bank accounts, and infinite pleasures. The possibility of acquiring all of these earthly securities brings us back again and again to the purchase of a ticket. Then, one day we win! Our dreams are fulfilled, and happiness is on the horizon. Then one day, we wake up and realize that nothing has really changed, and I am not as satisfied as I thought I was or would be. I find myself living in my incompleteness and with my profound sorrow and grief. I did not find joy.

Glimpses of joy are possible but not by material means. They are brought to us through incredible experiences of connection that bring us face to face with real and authentic faith, hope, and love. And, they are glimpses and do not last. The moment we find ourselves looking back at them, they are gone, and we find ourselves remembering the moment in memory. To carry joy within us is to realize that it is not something I create, manufacture or even acquire. It is not able to be purchased. It is a gift. My need for joy mirrors my need for eternity, for a Creator who has a claim on the very essence of who I am and desires a home within me. As C. S. Lewis discovered, joy is a surprise that speaks to my very soul and is given as gift by the God who loves me.

The beauty of Advent is found in discovering the beauty of the gift of joy. God has visited his people for no other reason than to show them where and how to find joy! All of our human and earthly joy experiences are always only glimpses. They never satisfy us, sustain us or fulfill us. It is only God who is the joy of my soul. Real, Divine experiences of joy catch us off guard, make us stop and become aware, bring a feeling of awe and rightness and have an eternal Otherness about them. Nothing created by humans can ever come close to this. We probably will not fully realize the truth of all of this until we actually meet God face to face in heaven one day. Then, in that sacred moment when our hearts leap for joy we will understand what we have been tirelessly searching for all along. Intense gratitude will most surely follow. ©LPi
