The Christmas Season...

2023

Blessings to all of you as we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent for a few hours and celebrate Christmas the same day. While we have a shortened season of Advent this year, I am just as happy to celebrate the Christmas Season.



Commercially, Christmas begins on or before October 31st and promptly ends at 11:59 P.M. on December 25th. For Catholics, however, Christmas really does begin on Christmas Eve and continues (for some) to the *Feast of the Epiphany* (January 7th) or the *Baptism of the Lord* (January 8th). Even still, it continues until the *Presentation of the Lord* (February 2nd).

Whenever you choose to conclude the season, I hope you can celebrate the “Season” of Christmas and impress upon your children the difference between Advent and Christmas. The world will not teach us this – it only happens in a household of faith.

One way of doing this – and I cannot urge it enough – **do not throw out your Christmas tree right after Christmas Day!**

In truth, it saddens me to see trees lining alleyways and houses. The evergreen tree is the symbol of new life. The lights of the tree symbolize the Light of the World. The ornaments symbolize the blessings of God. Indeed, many of you have ornaments commemorating first Christmases, children’s projects, and many blessings in your own life.

Keep them alive in your home a little while longer!

Likewise, Christmas and Easter have special periods called “Octaves,” which are the 8 days of Christmas in this case. The Octave of Christmas is a special period from Christmas Day to the Feast of the Holy Family that has special prayers. Why not celebrate the Christmas season by joining us for Mass during the week? We celebrate the infant Christ by celebrating the crucified and risen Christ.

I pray that each of you have a blessed Christmas, good health, and a growing faith in our Lord. I want to thank in a special way our staff, volunteers, decorators, and parishioners of Immaculate Conception who have supported our parish this past year. As we enter the Christmas Season, we are thankful for what God has done for us now, and always. We look forward to the Feasts of the Holy Family and of Mary, the Mother of God, on New Year’s Day. We know that our families, both nuclear, extended, and church, are important parts of our lives. We give thanks to God for our community and family as they are the people who form us to be children of God.

We also give thanks for all who served others this year: for the poor and needy, for the migrant and alien, for the hungry, for the dying and the dead, for those in need of instruction, for those in need of spiritual nourishment, and all other needs. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Christ as you serve Him through your neighbor.

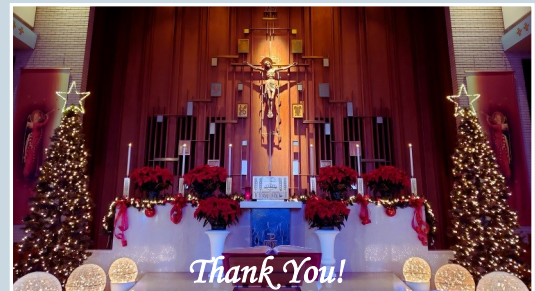

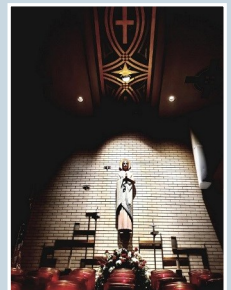

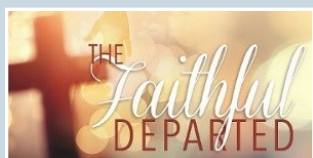

Christmas 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we celebrate the birth of Jesus, we also celebrate the birth of our hope. When he came among us as one like us in all things but sin, he lifted us up to new and transformed life. In fact, he opened for us the way to share in the very life of God. One of the prayers of the Mass gives us these words: "...may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity."

The struggles that we face in our personal lives and in our wounded world do not have the last word. We are meant for more. We are meant for full and eternal life. I pray that our celebration of the Lord's birth will remind us of the glory that will carry us beyond the challenges, sometimes truly significant challenges that mark our lives and our world.

We must also remember that the Lord did not just come among us once and long ago. He continues to walk with us as we walk with each other. Our celebrations of the Eucharist remind of that. And he will never abandon his people. He is now and always Emmanuel, our God with us. Our journey is his journey. 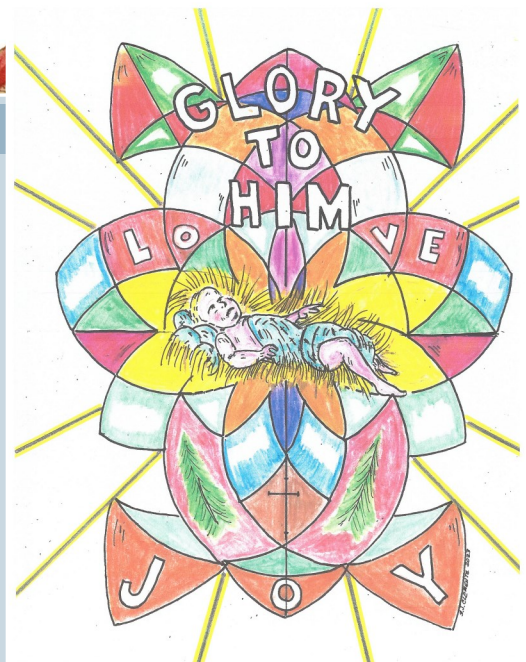

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained: Lighting Candles

Question: Why do Catholics light candles in church?

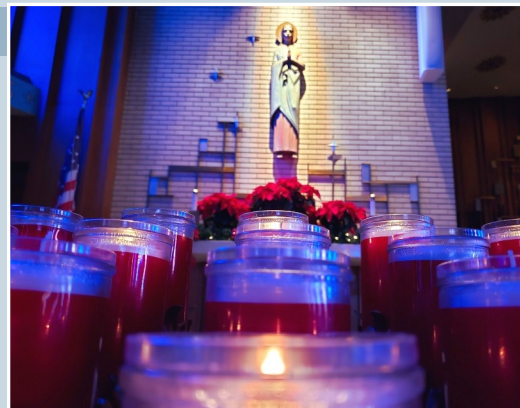
Answer: Candles have been a part of the Church's worship from the earliest times. In the days before electricity, candles and oil lamps were the ways that people lighted buildings. Even today, we often still depend on candles during power outages, relying on their flickering flames to bring light into the dark.

Like our ancestors, we also light candles on special occasions. Think about a festive family meal or a romantic dinner for two — there will often be candles on the table, special objects for a special event. We light candles on birthday cakes and carry them in processions. We also place candles at makeshift memorials that appear when there has been an accident or act of violence. In these moments, their light casts aside a different kind of darkness — the darkness of grief, fear, and death.

The custom of the early Christians lighting candles and lamps at the tombs of the martyrs gave way to the practice of having candles at Mass, honoring the sacredness of the celebration.

As Christians decorated their worship spaces with statues and icons, they would burn candles in front of sacred images and the relics of the saints, basically "shining a light" on what they held to be sacred. When pilgrims would visit these shrines, they would often bring candles to light before the image or relic. These candles came to be a symbol of the person, and their prayer, and the burning of these candles came to be understood as an extension and continuation of the prayer that was offered. What began as a practical way to provide light has come to be a symbol of the hopes, desires, loves, losses, fears, and faith of everyday Christians offering their prayers to God and his saints.
