### *A New Series For Your Reflection*

Over the past few years, we have had our seminarians assist us in various ways at IC. Most recently, you have seen Deacon Joseph preach at our Masses while the others (Jacob, Joseph, and Colin) assisted and we have also recently added Adoration and a simple Vespers service on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday evenings of each month at 6:00 P.M. We are happy to present, along with parishioners on our Seminary Support Committee, a new series of discussions entitled: *"Fruitful Harvest: Perspectives from a Seminarian's Journey."*

Foremost, we pray that our seminarians' time here with us is fruitful. It is also a blessing to learn from them and benefit from their zeal for ministry. Secondly, we hope that their perspective of approaching the topics below is both different and interesting to you. Lastly, we say 'journey,' because each of us are engaged in an ongoing formation process. Seminarians are no different – life takes its many twists and turns, and so we are formed by those experiences.

These sessions will take place in our Rectory Assembly after our 10:30 A.M. Mass on select Sundays (approximately from 11:30 A.M. until 1:00 P.M.) Light food and refreshments will be available. After a 15-minute guided discussion, we will break into smaller groups led by our seminarians.

Our three upcoming discussion topics are as follows:

**February 27<sup>th</sup> – Formation:** *"How Do Spiritual Practices And Habits Change Us?"*

March 27<sup>th</sup> – Relationships: *"How Do Our Relationships Inspire Us To Vocation?"*

May 1<sup>st</sup> – Liturgy and Prayer: *"How Do We Actively Pray Alone? In A Community?"*

The inspiration for this series stems from a few places. The structure of these sessions matches that of Alpha: food, reflection, discussion. Sharing a meal is a great way to bond and come together, and discussion allows us to engage with one another. We also wanted to attempt something a little different from the usual 'what's it like in the seminary' talks. While priesthood and seminary life are in one way different from everyday life, the call to discipleship is common to us all. These talks hope to engage you in a conversation about your relationship with God.

The first week, **"Formation,"** was selected because Ash Wednesday and Lent are right around the corner. The traditional habits of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving are asked of us every year. Do we, however, see these as formative actions? It is one thing to give up sweets, but do we give up something asking: 'how do I want to be formed by this experience?' Practices of doing something or giving up something are more impactful when we consider what our end goal is.

Our goal, from our seminarians' witness, is how they view *their* formation preparing them for the priesthood. The discussion in small groups afterward will explore how *you* might view spiritual formation as a mother, father, family members, day laborer, doctor, student, or wherever you find yourself today. Please join us **next Sunday, February 27<sup>th</sup>**, after our 10:30 A.M. Mass in our Rectory Assembly.

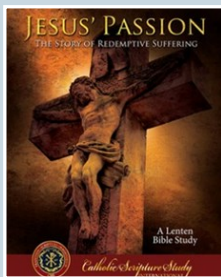

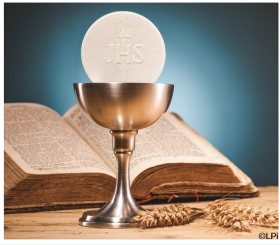

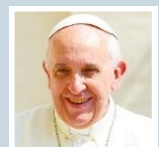

### Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Sometimes, Jesus' teachings don't seem to make practical sense. When we hear things like love your enemies and do good to them, turn the other cheek when struck, give to anyone who asks, do to others as you would have them do to you, be merciful, stop judging, forgive, and give to others, we get a bit unsettled. After all, it's okay for God to do all of these things, but does He really want us to do them, too? Many good-hearted Christians really draw the line with some of these ideals and say, "No way!" They even remark that if someone did something hurtful to someone they loved, they would have no reservations

seeking severe retribution. There is still this persistent thinking, even among those who consider themselves Christian, that a violent action deserves a violent response. Somehow, we continue to justify this.

Yet, it is most clearly against the very grain of the Gospel. Part of our difficulty has more to do with understanding God's love. We wrongly think that sinful or hurtful actions and evil people somehow are seen as lesser in God's eyes. They are not. God loves the sinner as much as He does the saint. And, both of these inclinations exist in every human being, even those who consider themselves holy. Both the capacity for good and the disposition toward evil exist in every one of us. Viktor Frankl has this to say when reflecting on the Holocaust: *"Our generation is a realistic generation because we have learned what a human being really is. When all is said and done, man is that same creature who invented the gas-chambers of Auschwitz; but he is also that being who walked upright into those chambers with the prayer 'Shema Yisrael' on his lips."*

If we believe in God, we have to act like God. Whether we like that idea is another issue. If we don't then perhaps, we need to reconsider our faith and whether we really believe in Jesus Christ. We are made in the image of God, not the image of ourselves. The Christian must, at all costs, leave resentment and the need for retaliation behind, lose defensiveness and bring into the mind and heart the realization of who we represent in this world. ©LPi
