



If you would like to join us during Lent for *Confessions* (on Tuesdays), *Vespers* (on Wednesdays), our 8:30 A.M. Mass (on Thursdays), or *Stations of the Cross* (on Fridays), please visit our parish website: www.icchicago.org or contact our Parish Office: 773.775.3833 to register.

If you are unable to join us in-person for either our Vespers Services on Wednesdays or our 8:30 A.M. Mass on Thursdays, we encourage you to join us virtually as both will also be livestreamed on our parish Facebook page (*Immaculate Conception Parish Chicago –Talcott*) as well as on our Twitch Channel: twitch.tv/icchicago.

The Way of the Cross will be prayed in our Church every Friday evening of Lent at 7:00 P.M. through March 26th. On April 2nd (*Good Friday*), our parish family will gather to pray the Stations of the Cross at



3:00 P.M. It is a traditional way of remembering what our Lord endured for us and how we continue to carry the Cross of Christ today. All are welcome!



Hearing Accessibility Update



Good news! There has recently been a new accessibility streaming network added to our parish. This network allows our church sound system to stream directly to a hearing aid or cochlear implant user's personal device through their cell phone. Tune in to hear the readings, sermons, and song lyrics with ease.

In order to access the network, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Connect your phone to the Wifi Network called, "IC Listen" using the password: "Immaculate" (note the capital "I").
- 2. Download the WaveCast App.
- 3. Open the WaveCast App and select the network called, "FM_PLUS."
- 4. Once you are connected, you should be able to hear our church audio streaming directly through your hearing aids or cochlear implants. You can adjust the volume using the slider within the app. Sliding to the right turns up the volume and sliding to the left turns down the volume.

As a reminder, in addition to this streaming network, we also have some other assistive listening devices available for check out from our ushers:

- 1. **Telecoil NeckLoop**: This device works as a transmitter, collecting our church's sound signal and sending it directly to the user's hearing aids or cochlear implants. This is the ideal option for a hearing aid or cochlear implant user who does not have a smartphone that is connected to their devices. In order for this Telecoil NeckLoop to work, the hearing aids or cochlear implants must be in a "telecoil program." If you are unsure if your device has this program, ask your audiologist.
- 2. **Wireless Receiver**: This device is best for someone who would like to hear better, but does not have their own set of hearing aids or cochlear implants. It also works as a transmitter, collecting our church's sound signal and sending it directly to the user's ears via headphones. You can use the headphones provided by our church or bring your own set of headphones and connect them to the device.

If you need any assistance setting up the smartphone app or assistive listening devices, feel free to ask me before the 8:30 A.M. or 10:30 A.M. Sunday Masses. I am an audiology student and love to help people hear better.

TRUTOUCH Ultra-HD LED Multi-Touch Displays

The goal during this school year and every school year is to engage our learners, whether they are in-person learning or remote learning. Made possible by grants, IC School was able to purchase a Trutouch Interactive Panel for each of our 24 classrooms. It will make it easier to keep students engaged and interested in class, make it convenient to record instruction when needed, and provide tools designed for better collaboration and more creative learning. During this pandemic COVID-19 school year, Immaculate Conception School has had to provide tools to students for remote learning. Students would not be able to do remote learning without 1:1 devices. These panels will provide a large format screen that can be shared easily on remote classes. Trutouch is providing free online professional development for all teachers so that they can utilize the new technology to the fullest advantage for our students in and out of the classroom during this unprecedented time.

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, "You are absolutely beaming!" The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone

into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new "digs," received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really "into it" this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it's only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen. ©LPi

When Sacrifice Becomes Mundane

It seems to happen every year, like clockwork: we drag a bit, as we enter into the second week of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we feel a bit like soldiers banging our shields, rushing into battle. "We're ready, God!" our hearts cry out. "Transform us through sacrifice! Your will be done!"

But by now, these Lenten resolutions are no longer novelties — they've joined the ranks of everyday inconveniences, which somehow are the hardest to bear. Because transformation, in real life, happens in inches, just as a battle is won slowly in the crash of one sword against another. It's not always a dramatic thing, to the naked eye. It's the perseverance in prayer despite weariness, or the continual denial of some pleasure even though there's that nagging voice in our minds saying: *go ahead*, *God doesn't really mind*.



It's a week when we all need a shock to the system — and wouldn't you know it, this Sunday God gives us a double-whammy of dramatic sacrificial scenes. We picture Abraham, who also cried "Ready!" when God called, never imagining what He would ask: the surrender of his long-awaited son. We see Christ himself transfigured, as God shows us what He is ready to give up for love of us.

We must remain committed, persevering daily in acknowledging that everything belongs to God. What we sacrifice, we simply give back to Him.
