#### Divine Renovation Conference: Part Two

Last week I wrote about leadership, which was the primary focus of the Divine Renovation Conference. In addition to this, I also preached about it at all our Masses last weekend. For those who were unable to join us at Mass, I have edited and uploaded the video of my homily on leadership to our YouTube Channel (a direct link to our channel can be found on our website: *icchicago.org*).

What I enjoyed most about this conference was that, in addition to the keynote addresses, which were common to all 650-some attendees, there were also numerous breakout groups—six per section for a total of twenty-four. Since you could only go to four of them, Patty, Michael, and I split our attentions on different things. I hope to share their reflections with you here in the coming weeks.

My sessions were focused on family engagement and parish leadership. The backdrop to everything was the creation of a vision and a plan to carry it out.



I have decided to primarily focus on leadership this year. Whether meeting with our teachers, our Alpha leaders, our ministers, and volunteers, I plan to invest my time into people willing to grow in their love of God and love of neighbor.



Parishes around the Archdiocese are closing, but in a recent conversation someone made a very salient point: "It's not that the Church is dying, it's that Church in the way we experienced it in the past is dying." We can either hold onto, embrace, and fight for a system, method, and rationale that leads to death, or we can be bold and look for something different.

This something "different" may mean many things to other people, but 'vision' is meant to both inspire and direct. A parish cannot be a mere collection of personal goals, but rather a community of believers who work together towards a common goal by contributing their many, varied talents. To that same end, the parish that is often dying is the


parish that just does a bunch of things—whatever it is—and claim that they serve. This is often untrue, because while individuals may benefit in some small way, the truth is that groups and outings often stand as a surrogate for the Baptized who are called individually in their lives to preach the Gospel.

In order to move away from a group-oriented parish/activity-oriented parish, we must create a sort of school of leadership.

Many priest friends of mine around the country feel similarly, with one saying to me from his diocese in Texas that, "I've come to realize that the only way to bring the Gospel into the world is to risk disappointment and failure." There will be failures, and the process here at Immaculate Conception will be slow and perhaps painful—and I am willing to venture that people who prefer the dying model of a parish might even walk away. The dying model includes a preference for simply doing things, as opposed to regularly challenging themselves with respect to their relationship with God and others.

Parishes can become insular, and while our groundwork that we have begun at IC might appear insular to start, I am taking the risk that investing time in our leaders now will ultimately allow us a more robust community experience in the future and, as such—in keeping with the Gospel—an ability to *make* disciples and to serve others truly. - *Fr. Matt*





## Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We can easily become quasi-hoarders, consumed with obtaining more tangible crutches. Our minds and hearts are always restless, and we never seem to be at peace.

Why do we so easily give our self-worth, value, and sense of security over to things? God certainly does not deny us the pursuit of a productive and enjoyable life but where do we draw the line? A sense of well-being and happiness can easily get deferred to sometime "in the future" while we continue to wrestle with the toils of today. There is no guarantee that there will be an earthly tomorrow and all of the frenzy we bring to securing our state in life will be for naught. 

Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Alphonsus Liguori (August 1st)

Saint Alphonsus was born into a well-respected family in 1696, in Marianella, in the Kingdom of Naples. He received an exceptional education through private tutors and was conferred degrees in civil and canon law at 16. He practiced law for 8 years before he turned to the Church. He was ordained a priest in 1726.

Saint Alphonsus traveled for 26 years in Kingdom of Naples preaching. His style of ministry was called "mission among the people," he and a group of priests or lay brothers would go to rural areas, staying for a time to teach, preach, and pray with the people

Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher, he was able to connect with ordinary people and his teaching and sermons were marked by his compassion. In a time of restrictive Church rule, where fear of God was truly fear, Saint Alphonsus taught about God's redeeming love. He also had a special devotion to Mary, praying to her for intercession and including devotions to her in his teaching. He wrote extensively, more than 100 books which have been through thousands of editions. His books are still available today and have been translated into more than 60 languages.

In 1762 Saint Alphonsus was made a bishop by Pope Clement XIII, however, he was eventually allowed to resign his post because of his ill health. He was paralyzed for a time from rheumatic fever in 1775, and had rheumatism so severe it was deforming, bending his head so far forward that his chin rested on his chest.

He died peacefully at the age of 90 in 1787. He was canonized in 1839 by Pope Gregory XVI, and in 1871 he was named a doctor of the church by Pope Pius IX. In 1950 he was declared patron of moral theologians by Pope Pius XII. ©LPi
