#### Homecoming

Hello everyone,

It has been six months, and what seemed like a long time is now a memory. I have finished my sabbatical and am now returning as pastor to *Immaculate Conception*.

I will share more photos and experiences at another time, but for now, I will recap my journey.

A 5,000 mile round-trip from Chicago to Galveston. Staying with a wonderful priest and community for a whole month, which included a once-in-a-generation snowstorm. Then I went from Texas and New Mexico to Phoenix, and from there through the Midwest back home.

A 14+ hour plane ride to Tokyo. From a Cubs game to cherry and plum blossoms, with imperial palaces, hidden gardens in the mountains, and feeding deer who are considered local deities.

A month in a Benedictine Monastery in Indiana which began with fourteen inches of rain in four days and celebrating Holy Week and Easter in a new place.

Lastly, driving some 1,000 miles around England and Ireland, which included pilgrimage sites in the most remote corners of the countryside, praying at the altars of my patron saints, a Shakespeare play, and staying in a home my great grandfather left behind 130 years ago to move to Chicago. (and yes, a lot of golfing).

If it sounds exhausting, the answer is 'yes.' I could give you written accounts of monuments and fantastic natural scenes or relate to you all-too-mundane interactions of daily life and people living just like us 17,000 miles away. Each experience, the great and the small, has their place.

For now, however, I am grateful to be home. In everything, I learned some things, reflected on my life up to this point, celebrating my 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of priesthood in a small room and on the road in the countryside. This time to really be with myself and by myself allowed me to reflect on my past, present, and future.

With those experiences and reflections, I hope to build upon what we are doing here at IC along with Fr. Michael, whom I appreciate immensely, as we work together with all of you.

Thank you for keeping me in your prayers, for your sporadic messages as I was away, and your warm welcomes. See you in the neighborhood,

#### THE MISSION WORK IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF KUMASI, GHANA

The Archdiocese of Kumasi in Ghana (West Africa), was established by the early missionaries in 1950. During these past years, there has been a tremendous growth of the Church in Ghana.

The Kumasi Archdiocese is located in the central part of Ghana. It has both rural and urban parishes. We undertake many projects as a means of evangelization to help our rural communities and the people of the diocese. We provide good and portable drinking water for rural communities. Many of these rural folks fetch water from the stream and rivers, which are polluted by the activities of Illegal Mining for Gold. The diocese helps to provide Wells and Boreholes to such deprived communities and rural schools so that people can have decent water to drink.



Very young people migrate from the rural communities to the cities in search of jobs. Unfortunately, when they come, there are no job opportunities for them. Some end up on the street and some of the young girls get abused, become pregnant and some of the young boys also get into bad companies/groups. The diocese is hosting a program called "Catholic Action for Street Children". In this project, we house many of these young people and those who are capable of going to school, we put them back into school and those who cannot are placed into technical, vocational and computer training so that they can have an opportunity for a decent life for themselves in the future.

We provide education for young people, particularly at the basic level by providing or maintaining some educational facilities for the rural communities. As part of the education, we train young teachers posted to deprived communities as Catechists to help the mission Churches.







Most Rev. Gabriel J. Anokye, the Archbishop of Kumasi, expresses his gratitude to the Church in America and acknowledges that the generosity of American Catholics has immensely improved the condition of many people of Kumasi and has aided the growth of the Church in Africa as a whole.

We thank you in much anticipation for your generosity and hospitality offered to our missionary representative, *Rev. Anthony Darko*, who will be visiting your parish community on the weekend of **July 12**th & **13**th and for the financial support you offer. Your parish family will be remembered in Masses and prayers offered by the priests, deacons, religious, and

missionaries serving in the Archdiocese of Kumasi, Ghana. God's Blessings be with you and your families.




# Preschool End Of Year Celebrations

# Exodus World Service Seeks Summer Volunteers

Disciples in Mission, a ministry made up of the O'Hare Neighborhood Grouping parishes of Immaculate Conception, Mary Seat of Wisdom, Our Lady of Hope, Our Lady of Ransom, St. Juliana, and St. Paul of the Cross, works directly with Exodus World Service to support families who have recently been received into our communities.

Exodus World Service is seeking volunteers for its summer activities, including:

#### **New Neighbors\***

Visit a newly arrived refugee family once a week for three months. This is a hands-on way to "welcome the stranger" in our midst. Volunteers and refugees have the opportunity to build bridges of understanding, cross-cultural learning and friendship. Volunteers answer basic questions about life in the U.S., help refugees practice their English and introduce them to their community.

#### New Neighbors for Youth\* - one of our greatest needs!

Adult volunteers visit weekly for three months with an elementary, middle, or high school student, coordinated with Exodus and the child's parents. Volunteers help increase academic skills and confidence through fun activities, and partner with refugee parents on how to support their child's learning. Resource guides are provided.

#### Heidi's House Summer Club

Volunteers come prepared with an activity to share with children. This includes the activity and any needed materials. It could be a science activity, art project, etc. Minimum commitment of one time, but a greater commitment would be very much appreciated! Prior to commitment, a conversation with program manager Anna Pospisil is requested. Heidi's House Summer Club is located in Wheaton.

#### Carry Your Cross

#### Question:

As Catholics, we talk a lot about "redemptive suffering" and "carrying your cross." What does that mean practically in daily life?

#### Answer:

When Jesus spoke these words, they would have sounded quite intense to his hearers. "Pick up your cross daily and follow me." At the time, Jesus hadn't yet

been crucified. A cross was a Roman torture instrument. "Pick up the thing that tortures you the most," Jesus seemed to say. Unfortunately, most of us have no real shortage of these in our life. To take up the cross isn't to seek out new sufferings in our life. It's to accept the life we have.

Of course, unjust or unhealthy circumstances should be rectified when possible. But there are always circumstances that remain out of our immediate control. It could be pain management, the defiance of our teenage child, or an unhealthy work environment ... but you need the paycheck to pay the bills. In difficult circumstances, it can be easier to blame, complain, or daydream our way out of it. None of these are real solutions, since none of them accept the reality of the situation at hand. Those options only add to our suffering, since they damage relationships, fixate on the problem, or set up unrealistic expectations.

Instead, Jesus invites us to take up our cross — to look at the uncomfortable situation square in the eyes, take a deep breath, and do our best to be present to God's grace in the moment. To love those in our path. To take things one step at a time.  $\bigcirc$ LPi


