

#### Summer Plans

I hope that everyone's summer has been well so far. We recently concluded a series of big events, and we are now proceeding with our major project in our school – a 2-year asbestos abatement plan while installing new floors. All has been smooth thus far, so we thank God for everyone who has worked hard to plan and execute everything — my thanks to Vince, our *Director of Operations*, especially.



We likewise published a video recently on our YouTube page outlining the brief history of Immaculate Conception. You will find a link to it on the home page of our website. We have more video plans as well as a fundraiser to improve the aspects of our Church—more will be forthcoming on that this August.

We also thank and wish Fr. Robert Carlton well after his two years of service here at IC, excluding his additional year as a Deacon. He will be going to St. Giles in Oak Park. This weekend, he will be presiding at all our Masses, so please do wish him well and take a moment to connect with him as he prepares to move on to his new assignment.



With that said, the number of available priests is very limited. As such, I will be here as our parish's only priest for the following year. This presents with it a number of challenges, but not unexpected ones given recent years. As it stands, I will have to be strategic about how my team and I spend our time and energy. With our Alpha program expanding, and investing in our ministers and volunteers, I want to do everything to encourage and support our parishioners to grow spiritually and, as such, give them the freedom to build the kingdom of God with me here at IC.

We will be making some minor changes to our Mass schedule. While our weekend Masses will remain the same, I will be temporarily suspending our Friday daily Masses (as of July 8th), with the intention of resuming them when we either have an associate or consistent external help. All those who have scheduled Mass intentions on Fridays are being contacted to switch to another date. In absence of that, they will be transferred to either Thursday at 8:30 A.M. or Saturday at 5:00 P.M.. I will keep those who attend our daily Masses informed as we progress throughout the year.


As we subtract, I also hope to add: I am looking at additional schedules of prayer such as Adoration on some Saturdays prior to our 5:00 P.M. Mass, along with special Masses and prayer services throughout the year. We are also looking at altering our Family Mass schedules, which we will publish soon — these changes were made to better accommodate our school families, and to avoid long weekends and other conflicts. We are also looking at additional hospitality offerings to create more space for parishioners to get to know and interact with one another. Similarly, we will publish a basic schedule regarding that soon.

As we move to the future, pray that our efforts are fruitful. IC is growing, and cultivating that growth into a position of strength, requires the love and effort of many people. We have come where we are because of great sacrifices of love, and for this I am grateful.

entertaining for all present!























## Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



And to another he said, "Follow me." In every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling us. We can easily get distracted and not hear it or simply ignore it, pretending it wasn't even heard. When we do hear it and favorably respond, there are some conditions that must be met. Jesus makes it clear that once we say yes to his invitation, we must stay focused and forge ahead. We cannot keep looking behind or worry about unfinished business. There are some tasks, and discipleship is one, that require our full devotion.

There are many "masters" vying for our attention. We need something or someone to give us direction. Human nature requires it. Our motives and actions reveal what has our allegiance. It is tempting to give ourselves to masters that lure us with intriguing promises. When given the choice between a "master" that promises worldly success, abundant wealth, status, privilege, and security versus a "master" that asks for self-sacrifice, hardship, suffering, ridicule, and death, to whom do we go? While the promise of immediate pleasure is enticing, there is always a catch. For all that secular masters can promise, they always keep us looking behind, checking on ourselves, second guessing choices, calculating options, and being slaves to excessive worry. Our guard can never come down. Only one master really promises life: Jesus Christ. Hearing his call, we either trust him or we don't.

Saying yes to following Christ does come with a risk. But it also comes with the brightness of future hopes and dreams. There is no need to keep looking behind. Sins are forgiven and regrets serve no effective purpose. God is not there. He's moved beyond all that stuff. God is in the today and the tomorrow and what he can continually do with our daily affirmation to follow Him. All we need to do is be obedient. St. Gianna Molla is credited with saying, "The stillness of prayer is the most essential condition for fruitful action. Before all else, the disciple kneels down." Begin with prayer. We will not only hear God's call but find the courage to trust that He will guide us where we need to be. God uses us in the most ordinary of ways through the simple daily expression of our lives. ©LPi



Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Oliver Plunkett (July 1st)

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling

across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible. ©LPi




