Love God, Serve Others, Make Disciples

Pastor Reflection

Anyone who takes their spiritual life seriously realizes that there are many twists and turns on our journey of faith. Our life in Christ would be easy if all we had to do was to be baptized, receive religious instruction as a child, and participate in Mass. Those steps are important, to be certain, but our growth in faith involves far more. The spiritual life is not static because it is ultimately a relationship with the living God. Relationships change. They grow or diminish. They are challenged in times of crisis and they mature with patience and trust. Our relationship with God reflects the same pattern. As we grow older, our experience of life and faith expands.



As we enter into the season of Lent, we have a prime opportunity to grow deeper in our relationship with God. Each of us will approach Lent from a unique perspective and yet all of us come to these 40 days of Lent as fellow travelers on the faith path that leads to a deeper communion with God. I urge you not to pass up the offer of grace that God holds out to you this Lent. Lent is not another "self-help" program, but a God-driven opportunity in which the Lord promises to reshape us according to His plan. We can commit ourselves to more intensive prayer, almsgiving, spiritual disciplines that include fasting and abstaining, and spiritual practices like Lenten Missions, the Stations of the Cross, and Lenten Vespers, but God gives the increase. The purpose of all of our Lenten efforts is to predispose us for what God desires to do for us.

This Lent, I strongly encourage you to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Perhaps it has been a long time since you went to Confession, but please don't let that discourage you from coming to the sacrament. Don't worry about not knowing what to do when you come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation as the priest confessor will guide you through the steps. I also encourage all of you to pick up the Scriptures and read a few passages from the New Testament. Let the Word of God speak to you and let God's Word stir up within you the wonderful mercy and forgiveness God wants to offer you. Finally, I want to encourage families to keep Lent at home. The Lenten Season should give our homes a special character. Perhaps it's an agreed upon Lenten discipline for the whole family, such as fewer TV and internet hours, or fewer stops at fast food restaurants. A simple prayer at the table each night or before bedtime may help to make Lent a true season of grace for the family. Consider a family shrine for Lent, or perhaps your family can give the cross a special place of honor in your home. May this Lent be fruitful - not only for each one of us individually, but for the renewal of our parish community as well.

Lenten Regulations

(from February 26, 2020, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

"Lent is ordered to preparing for the celebration of Easter. Since the Lenten liturgy prepares for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, both catechumens, by the various stages of Christian Initiation, and the faithful, who recall their own Baptism and do penance." (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year, #27)

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer, the church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake the serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

"(On) weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance."






