During this time of uncertainty and anxiety, I pray that you and your loved ones are safe and healthy. This crisis challenges us to act responsibly by following the social isolation guidelines while striving to stay close emotionally and spiritually to our families, our friends and our communities. Please join me in praying for those affected by COVID-19, as well as our first responders, health care workers and individuals who have lost income due to precautionary closures.

Times such as these highlight the need for the spiritual sustenance and community connectivity our Archdiocese parishes provide every member of our Catholic community. To protect the safety of our community, most pastoral services are currently being performed virtually. It is critically important that our parishes and pastors receive the offertory support they need to remain operational and sustainable despite the suspension of weekly Masses. The Archdiocese has developed a <u>universal online offertory page</u> where the faithful can make an offertory donation to any parish in the Archdiocese. These donations will assist the parishes with ongoing expenses related to ministry, maintenance, staff and other pressing needs, that depend on regular offertory support from parishioners. Many of our parishes are suffering significant financial hardship during this challenging time. Your online support will make a critical difference.

Additionally, as we are sensitive to the financial hardship suffered by many in recent days, we have also launched a <u>Coronavirus Emergency Fund</u>. This fund will support members of our community who have been negatively affected by the pandemic. For example, the fund will support parents of Catholic school students who might struggle with tuition payments because of unexpected job loss, ministries providing the needy with sustenance or parish communities deeply harmed by the pandemic. With an eye towards bridging the physical divide between us and cultivating a meaningful virtual community at IC during this time of forced seclusion, we are exploring alternative methods of uniting our community in prayer and conversation by utilizing a communication tool entitled Zoom Video Conferencing. As of Monday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> we will pray the rosary daily at 11:00 A.M. (Monday through Saturday) hosted by Deacon Rick & his wife Carol [Zoom Meeting Room/ID Code: 7902114314]. At 3:00 P.M., we will pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet and engage in faith conversations (Monday through Saturday) hosted by our parishioner Mario Orrico & Fr. Robert [Zoom Meeting Room/ID Code: 7661741428]. Zoom will offer you the opportunity to see and hear members of our community praying together and engaging in conversations about their faith (as well as sharing their hopes and fears during this challenging time in our lives), while also allowing you to interact and participate as well.

Although we are temporarily restricted from physically assembling together as a parish family and encountering Christ through the Eucharist, if we are open to experimenting with the technology that is available to us, we can still embrace the underlying power of our community (as the body of Christ) by being emotionally and spiritually present for one another - so that we can continue to prayerfully support one another and remain connected in heart and mind. As God is ever-present, so we too strive to be here for you as a parish staff - to walk with you, to counsel you, to support you, to comfort you and to assure you that you are not alone.

### Parishioners and Guests of Immaculate Conception...

As a precautionary measure, due to concerns relating to public health, all liturgical services have been suspended in our Church until further notice (as mandated by Cardinal Cupich and the Archdiocese of Chicago.) This includes all daily and weekend Masses as well as Stations of the Cross (Friday evenings), Lenten Vespers (Tuesday evenings), and Reconciliation/Confessions (Saturday afternoons.)



Please be advised that, due to Governor Pritzker's Shelter-In-Place mandate for the state of Illinois (effective as of 5:00 P.M. on Saturday, March 21st), both our Church and Parish Office will be closed until Tuesday, April 7th. As such, we are regrettably unable to offer opportunities for private prayer in our Church on Sundays at this time. While voicemail messages will continue to be monitored remotely on a daily basis by a member of our Parish Staff, we encourage you to connect with us via email at frontdesk@icparish.info with any questions, concerns

or needs that may arise during the time the Shelter-In-Place order is in effect.

#### Worship from Home...

In lieu of gathering together for Mass at IC, we encourage our parishioners and guests to honor the Lord's Day by viewing our weekly broadcast of Sunday Mass at 11:00 A.M. featuring Fr. Robert & Fr. Matt (accompanied by Scott, our Director of Worship, on keyboard) which will be livestreamed through social media platforms Twitch TV and Facebook Live. Direct links to both platforms are easily accessible on our parish website (www.icparish.net). Weekday Masses will also be livestreamed daily [Monday through Friday] at 7:00 P.M. Our weekly School Mass will be broadcast on Wednesdays at 11:00 A.M. All livestreamed Masses will be recorded and archived for a limited time.

Private Masses will continue to be celebrated by Fr. Robert & Fr. Matt daily to honor the intentions of the day. Each Mass will also be offered for the wellbeing of our community and our city as we continue to pray for all those affected by the current Coronavirus outbreak, both locally and globally, so that they may be healed by our compassionate and merciful Father and find comfort and peace in His love.

Lenten Regulations (from February 26, 2020, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.



"Lent is ordered to preparing for the celebration of Easter. Since the Lenten liturgy prepares for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, both catechumens, by the various stages of Christian Initiation, and the faithful, who recall their own Baptism and do penance." (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year, #27)

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer, the church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake the serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

"(On) weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance."

(U.S. Bishops statement on penitential observances, 1966)

### Learning Hasn't Stopped at IC School!



On Friday, March 13th, we received official word from the Archdiocese that all Catholic Schools would shut down for 2 weeks due to the Coronavirus (COVID19). Each school was asked to design and implement a rigorous e-learning plan. Electronic learning (e-learning) relates to student learning that is delivered through technology.

In a matter of 3 days, the teachers at IC had to switch their teaching plans from in-person, face-to-face lessons to e-learning. Using their knowledge, creativity and passion for teaching, they all some up with deily plans that engured students would continue learning. Assignments

they all came up with daily plans that ensured students would continue learning. Assignments were posted each day covering Religion, Math, ELA, Science and Social Studies, questions were answered through email and grades (letter, pass/fail or completed) were given. What they managed to do was nothing short of extraordinary!

I sent daily Parent Grams through our Fast Direct system to keep parents updated and to encourage them to contact their child's teacher if they had any questions, concerns or were feeling overwhelmed. Obviously, this is new for everyone, but we have been working together to ensure that our students continue learning without too much frustration (for the students or the parents).

Although our texts and videos are available online, teachers were looking for ways to improve instruction so they began using technology like: *Google Classroom*, *SeeSaw*, *Zoom* and *Google Hangout* which are all great ways for students to be able to see their teachers presenting a lesson or reading to the class. It also helps to see other students so you feel less isolated and more a part of the IC community.

On Friday, March 20th, our Art teacher taught a lesson using *Instagram* and 188 students tuned in. This was definitely the largest class she has ever taught! She plans to continue offering new art lessons on Wednesdays and Fridays at 12:30 P.M.

I will end each school day at 3:00 P.M. with prayer, announcements (including birthdays) and my joke of the day. This will be live through *YouTube*.

We pray for an end to this virus, hopeful that we can return to school soon. But as we wait, learning must go on! Stay healthy!




There is also a 24/7 commercial-free radio station called WAOB 106.7 FM, which stands for We Are One Body. It's found on the internet and is available on the TuneIn radio app. It offers a wide range of religious programming, such as the daily Mass, Rosary, reflections on the saints and scripture – just to name a few.

To get started, visit their website: http://www.waob.org/ to listen live or download their iPhone/Android application for your particular time zone. Since they broadcast 24/7 commercial-free, you may want to look at their schedule tab on the Home Page to get an idea when a program might be broadcasted for the day.

If you happen to miss a program, there's an option to select a different time zone to hear it. For example, the daily Mass is broadcast at 8:00 A.M. Eastern or 7:00 A.M. Central time. However, you do have an option to hear it again by selecting another time zone, such as Mountain or Pacific time. And if you have a smart device at home, you can ask Alexa to play WAOB We Are One Body on TuneIn Radio.
