Easter - Rise From The Dead

Earlier in the year I reflected with our schoolchildren about this simple mathematical fact:

If you were to spend 1 hour in church every Sunday (School Mass does not count), how much of your year, percentage-wise, would you spend? Adults and children alike proposed answers such as 35%, 10%, 60%, 8%, etc.

The actual answer is more telling: 0.59%

Even if it took you a whole hour in the morning to get here and back, it would still be: 1.187%

When posed with the prospect of being here every week, does it feel insurmountable? Burdensome? Unreasonable?

If the sacrifice of Christ are these things to you, then you are dead in sin.

But we are not called to be dead in sin, but rather dead *to* sin and alive in Christ.

I proposed that if you participate in travel sports, a near-daily, year-round enterprise, you might spend 5-7% of your year in such things. One week's vacation would be 1.9%; summer vacation is 22% of the year—God, and the Church, only ask for .59% of your time.

How could such a small amount make a difference?

Our Scripture is clear: "Therefore, just as through one person sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all, inasmuch as all sinned" (Romans 5:12). And likewise, "Just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so through one righteous act acquittal and life came to all" (Romans 5:18).

Through one man in the many billions, sin reigned. Through the one man, the God-man (that is to say, the Word made Flesh), all were redeemed. A single hour spent before God in humble prayer accomplishes more than many hundreds of hours of work. This is because works do not save us, but rather an active faith that draws us closer to our Lord in His Passover, His Cross, and Resurrection.

It is my earnest prayer that each of us turn from sin daily—myself included—and trust in the Resurrection of Christ, drawing near to the Word and Mysteries of our redemption.

A mere half of a percent seems like nothing – throwaway, and of no consequence.

Christ on the cross was the same:

"He was spurned and avoided by men, a man of suffering, knowing pain, like one from whom you turn your face, spurned, and we held him in no esteem. Yet it was our pain that he bore, our sufferings he endured.

We thought of him as stricken, struck down by God and afflicted, but he was pierced for our sins, crushed for our iniquity. He bore the punishment that makes us whole, by his wounds we were healed.

We had all gone astray like sheep, all following our own way; But the Lord laid upon him the guilt of us all" (Isaiah 53:3-6).

"Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:9-11). 


