

## Lenten Regulations

(from February 26, 2020, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

*"Lent is ordered to preparing for the celebration of Easter. Since the Lenten liturgy prepares for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, both catechumens, by the various stages of Christian Initiation, and the faithful, who recall their own Baptism and do penance." (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year, #27)*

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer, the church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake the serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

*"(On) weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance."*

(U.S. Bishops statement on penitential observances, 1966)



## Liturgical Notes: The Sign of Peace & Holy Communion with regards to the Coronavirus...

The Archdiocese of Chicago continues to monitor with concern the questions that are arising about the spread of the Coronavirus/COVID-19. As a matter of prudence, we have been asked to implement the following guidelines/preventive measures in our parish, based on guidance from the USCCB Committee on Divine Worship, effective immediately.

First and foremost, please know that our Presiders, Deacons and liturgical ministers always take extra care to practice good hygiene before Mass begins, making certain to thoroughly wash their hands in preparation for ministering Holy Communion to our community. Our lay ministers use an alcohol-based anti-bacterial hand sanitizer before approaching the altar, as well as after they have distributed Holy Communion. Likewise, if one of our ministers is ill, they will request another minister to serve in their place.

For the time being, we will be suspending distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful via the chalice. Additionally, given the frequency of direct contact with saliva in the distribution of Holy Communion on the tongue, every consideration should be given by each individual to receive Holy Communion reverently in open hands for now. We also respectfully request that you refrain from physical contact during the Sign of Peace. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal does not mandate a particular gesture to use in the Rite of Peace. A nod of the head and a smile can accompany the verbal sharing of Christ's peace, rather than extending a hand to those near (as is customary.) We also request that you kindly refrain from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer, as well as refrain from using our Holy Water fonts.

Finally, we respectfully ask that you please act responsibly if you are feeling unwell. To that end, we would like to take a moment to assure our faithful parishioners and guests that if you are sick or are experiencing symptoms of sickness, you are not obliged to attend Mass - and out of charity, you ought not to attend. (Catechism 2181 allows for the faithful to miss Mass for serious reasons like illness.)

Please join our parish family in praying for all those who are sick, particularly for those affected by the Coronavirus and other communicable diseases, that our compassionate Father touches all those affected by the current outbreak with healing and peace.


