Dear all,


As we continue our Easter Season, we give thanks for many things in the month of May:

Firstly, to Christ and the resurrection where he promises new life to each of us.

Second, to our Mothers on this Mother's Day weekend. Mothers give each of us the gift of life along with our fathers, and we honor the nurturing love of Motherhood that allows us to be who we are today.

Third, our First Communicants who celebrated the special sacrament of a new covenant with God in Christ.

As you can see, there is much to celebrate. May is a beautiful month in many ways. In it, we are also offering a special blessing for the rededication of our parish on the 20th and 21st (originally May 26th, 1963) during all our Masses. We hope

This is a good time to update you on a few projects currently in progress around our parish campus:

1) Many have inquired about the fountain area at the front of our church where some demo work has been done. We are currently in the process of transforming the area into a garden, along with lighting for our Mary statue, and a new retaining wall.

The project is underway, and we are waiting on some final details to be confirmed before we move forward with construction. As mentioned previously, the damage and cost from plumbing was such that we decided to go in a new direction with the space. We believe that going in this direction will make the space easier to maintain, more presentable for an extended period of time during the year and highlight our beautiful statue of Mary.



2) We received our new piano at Christmastime, and our new presider and deacon chairs arrived during Holy Week. Our benches and kneelers for the sanctuary are now complete and we await a delivery date. Our brass work is also in process, and I hope to present it soon. It has been almost 60 years since they were attended to, so we will see them as they were all those years ago. Lastly, we are still reviewing assorted designs for our

landscaping project in front of our school, so I hope to have it done once we find the right one.



3) Flooring in our School: We are entering the last phase of our major improvement project in our school. Abating asbestos and installing new, clean floors in all classrooms. The current classrooms featuring the new flooring look warm and provide a great environment for our children to learn. We look forward to taking new pictures this summer.

Thank you for your support of these projects! We are having our final School Board, Finance Council, and Parish Council meetings of the year as we review the past year and prepare for our new plans and projects for the next (and beyond).

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, "I will not leave you orphans." God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.

We are not orphans anymore! This Easter, that's the story we should share with others. It's the true story we are living right now. – *Father John Muir* ©LPi



Saint of the Week: Examples of our Faith - Servant of God Juliette Toussaint



Servant of God Marie-Rose Juliette Toussaint was born Marie-Rose Gaston in 1786 in Saint Domingue which is present day Haiti. She and her family were enslaved and moved with their enslavers, the Noels, to Baltimore during the Haitian Revolution. In her early 20's, she met Venerable Pierre Toussaint - also on his way toward sainthood right now - an affluent New York man who had been enslaved and also immigrated from Haiti. He purchased her freedom, and they were married on August 5, 1811.

Juliette and Pierre quickly established themselves as a charitable force to be reckoned with in New York City! The adopted Euphémie, the daughter of Pierre's late sister, who died of tuberculosis, and raised her as their own child. Throughout their life together, Juliette and Pierre also adopted numerous black children from the streets of New York, raised them as their own, and helped them establish their own prosperous lives. They would shelter travelers and homeless folk and they went to daily Mass and

participated in many local ministries.

Although they were bringing frequent treats and baked goods to the local orphanage, helping Haitian refugees find jobs, fostering and adopting children, and donating significant amounts of their personal money to charitable organizations, the Toussaints wanted to do even more. They worked together to continue their daily jobs but also to establish careers of charity. During yellow fever outbreaks, the couple temporarily repurposed their home as an infirmary to care for the sick in their neighborhood. Together, they created an employment agency for immigrants and freed slaves, a refuge for retired priests, and they even organized a credit bureau!

Later in life, with a congregation of sisters — the Oblate Sisters of Providence — Juliette and her husband helped fund the establishment of the very first New York City Catholic School for Black Children. They also helped finance the building of a new Roman Catholic church which became The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral in Lower Manhattan and is still in use today, as well as helped finance St. Vincent De Paul church on New York's Canal Street. Secular causes also got attention from Juliette. She is credited with gifting the New York African Society for Mutual Relief the property on which they built their meeting hall!

Juliette died of natural causes on May 14, 1851, at the age of 65 and is buried along with her husband and their child at the church they helped build, Old St. Patrick's. She is recognized as a Servant of God for her incredible virtue and holiness. © LPi
