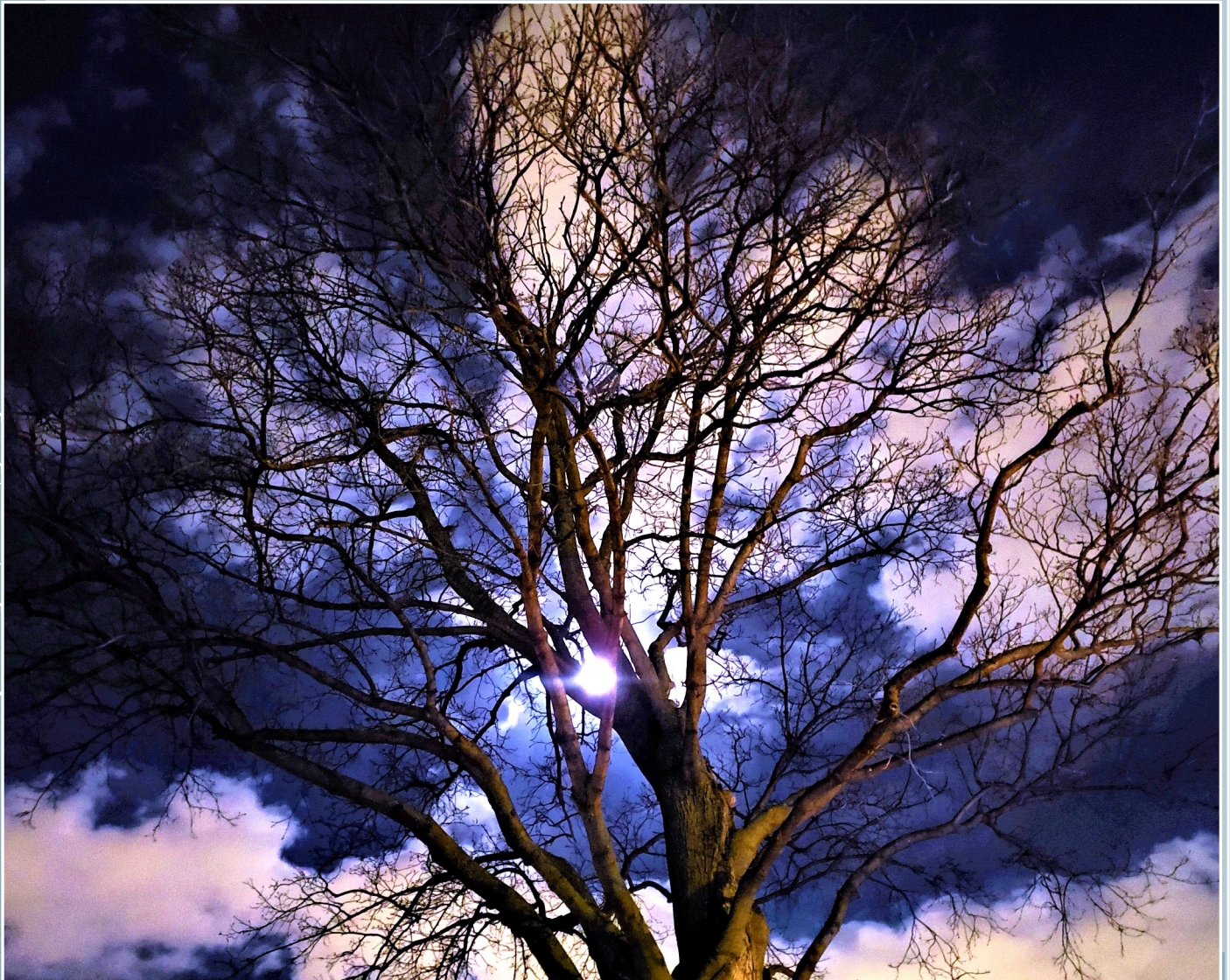

Long-Term Plans and Leadership Pipelines

A Blessed Easter to everyone as we proclaim the Risen Christ!

Already we approach the month of May full of activity and anticipation of what is to come. Our various Councils, my staff, and I are all working hard preparing for the summer and beyond, so allow me to share a few updates with you presently:

1) We conclude Year 2 of our long-term plan having focused on Communications, Hospitality, and Discipleship.

We are planning more robust *hospitality* offerings throughout the year. Inspired by the response to our seminary round-table discussions, we are planning to offer more opportunities for small group discussion and faith sharing among fellow parishioners. Likewise, we are also looking to add more opportunities for us to be together.

Regarding *communications*, we are currently working on a new system and structure to unify our messaging to our entire community – school and church. We hope that in digitizing this, we can better inform our parishioners of events, spiritual opportunities, and more.

Discipleship is the method by which we are building up our parish and looking towards more stable growth. This has included our Alpha program which saw a record twenty participants averaging each meeting! As of now, about seventy parishioners are considered ‘*alumni*’ of the program. To that effect, we are working on building new “*Connect Groups*.” These are post-Alpha groups which will focus more on investing in the individuals in terms of prayer, service, ministry, and community.

Similarly, we are expanding our Alpha offering, hoping to invite more people and expand our team. More details to come later.

2) To that end, I also want to tell you how we are regarding a “*Leadership Pipeline*.” Leadership in the parish can be defined in different ways in terms of function (finance, inviting, service, etc.), but leadership for us as parishioners ties into our Parish Mission: “*Parishioners are committed to worship, connect, grow, serve, and give.*” Being a “*parishioner*” means that someone is invested personally in being these things for IC. Beyond that, a Leader wants to inspire these qualities in themselves and in others in a healthy way.

For years we have relied on our Alpha program as a sort of ‘*foundation*’ by which we engage individual parishioners who wish to have an encounter with Christ. From these encounters, we have seen great growth and change, and the outpouring of love and dedication from so many of our participants is truly the future of IC – people genuinely invested in their faith and in their community, willing to sacrifice so that others can have a moving experience as well.

This ‘*pipeline*’ refers to the process of **Alpha – Connect – Discipleship**. These three groups refer to the three aspects of our mission: “*Introduce People to Christ*” (**Alpha**), “*Equip them for ministry*” (**Connect**), and “*Send them out to transform the world*” (**Discipleship**). We are fortunate to be ready to build into Phase 2 of our mission. We are raising up leaders who are grounded in a mutual love for God and each other. I could not be more excited for what 2022 and 2023 brings to IC.

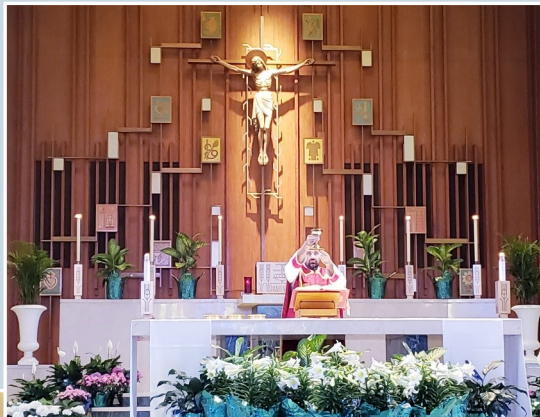


Fruitful Harvest Series - Sunday, May 1st @ 11:30 A.M.

Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



Could it be that God's image has become so soiled and distorted that it is hard for us to see it? Our self-serving agendas have done a great job twisting God's image into what profits us. We want our agenda to be God's agenda and use prayer as the convincing leverage we need. Worse still, our success and egocentric agenda often erases God's image completely, replacing it with our own. St. Oscar Romero instructs us that the Son of Man "*dies on the cross to cleanse God's image, which is soiled in today's humanity, a humanity so enslaved, so selfish, so sinful.*" Striving to preserve control of our destinies at all costs, we fail to see the risen suffering servant, the Christ, standing right beside us.

Jesus, who suffered and died on a cross and was raised from the dead, corrects our soiled image of God. He shows us God as God is, not who we want to make God to be. God is the God of the poor, the weak, and the marginalized. He is the God who tenderly caresses us when we are suffering and hurting, assuring us that all will be safe and well. He is the God of equity, peace, justice, and compassion who wants happiness for each of His children, desiring their wellbeing and success. God goes where men and women are afraid to go, sitting with the lost, the broken, and the sorrowing. St. Oscar Romero challenges us to illuminate with "*Christ's light ... even the most hideous caverns of the human person: torture, jail, plunder, want, chronic illness. The oppressed must be saved.*" The resurrection calls us to be God's microphone, a messenger, and a prophet (St. Oscar Romero).

Using eyes that see beyond the limited constructs and desires of our world, we can see the true and real Jesus standing before us, calling us to transformation and change. Asking us more than once, "*do you love me?*" We are beckoned to give an answer. Answering in the affirmative, it is now our task to feed the sheep and the lambs who belong to God. In short, equipped with the power of the resurrection and a corrected image of God our task is to make things better, brighter, holier, more life-giving, and just for all of God's children. Considering our choices, our interactions, our philosophies, and aspirations, how can we do this? ©LPi

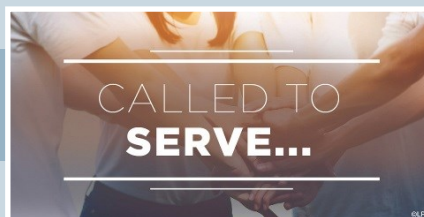

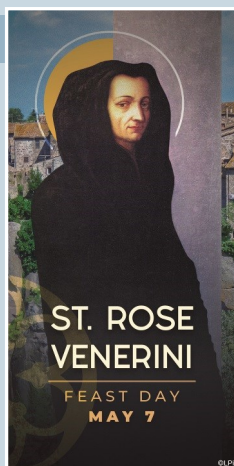

Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Rose Venerini (May 7th)

The story of St. Rose of Venerini (February 9, 1656 – May 7, 1728) is one of having faith in God and his calling in your life. Born in Italy in 1656, she was the daughter of a doctor. Following the death of her fiancé, she entered a convent in the hopes of becoming a nun, but soon returned home to care for her mother after the death of her father. In an effort to keep up her spiritual side, St. Rose invited women of the neighborhood to recite the rosary in her home, and together they formed a sodality.

Unsure of where her life was headed, she sought the spiritual guidance of a Jesuit priest. After much contemplation, she admitted to feeling called to be a teacher in the world, rather than a nun in a convent. Eventually, she moved ahead and opened a free school for girls in 1685. Eventually, she was invited to oversee the training of teachers and the administration of schools in the Diocese of Montefiascone, which then led to being called upon to organize schools in many parts of Italy, including Rome.

St. Rose died in Rome in 1728 amid a number of miracles that many credit to her. The group of women she first prayed with in her home eventually became known as the Venerini Sisters, found in the United States and working among Italian immigrants. St. Rose was beatified in 1952 and canonized in 2006. ©LPi

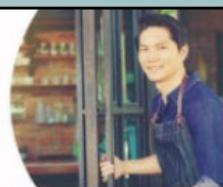
