the brief roundtable reflection was an enjoyable way to cover a lot of ground from a variety of perspectives. Secondly, featuring small group discussions is a great way for participants to actively engage with the content and with their fellow parishioners. One plan currently under consideration for the future is to host three sessions in the Fall and three in the Spring, but to now also include parishioners as a part of the panel with our seminarians.

As for our final session, entitled "*The Gift of Prayer*", each of our seminarians reflected on prayer from the following angles:





Colin – reflected on how good friendships, ones where we can be vulnerable and honest, can be the basis of more fruitful prayer. Being open to people we trust helps us to reflect on how God works in our lives.

Joseph – reflected on how as we grow older and invest in our relationship with God, the old can be new again. We can carry with us certain prayers and texts from Scripture which gain new significance as we continue to evolve and open ourselves up to God.

Deacon Joseph – reflected on how he will soon lead others in prayer as a priest. He looked back on the example of parents, neighbors, and community who instilled in him a sense of belonging. This sense of community also fuels his passion to lead and teach communities in prayer.

Reflections From Fr. Robert Carlton: Catholic Conversion Stories

One of the first readings from daily Mass recently recounts the famous story from the ninth chapter of the Acts of the Apostles of the Conversion of Saul, who had been "breathing murderous threats against the disciples of the Lord," to become Paul, "who began at once to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues that he is the Son of God." Paul's conversion happened almost immediately and was seemingly a one-way street, as he was knocked off his horse by "a light from the sky that suddenly flashed around him" on his way to Damascus to arrest and bring back to Jerusalem any Christians that he may have found. After being knocked off his horse, Paul got up and was unable to see anything and was led by the hand to Damascus, where "for three days he was unable to see, and he neither ate nor drank."

One of the problems with this story is that it can give people the idea that real conversions can happen almost immediately, and people can wait for their "*road to Damascus*" moment and miss the things that are happening around them. There are, to be sure, some instances in Christian history that approximate Saul's conversion on the road to Damascus. One of the most well-known ones is the apparition of Mary to the peasant Juan Diego in modern day Mexico City in 1531. This apparition led directly or indirectly to the conversion of all of Mexico in the ten years subsequent to it - nine million people converted to Christianity in that period, which means that three thousand people a day converted every day for ten years. One could make the argument that this apparition is the single most important event in the development of the history of Latin America, given the continued commitment of that part of the world to Catholicism. However, conversions are generally much longer and more involved processes and they tend to take a good amount of time and require work and initiative on both sides.

One of the more dramatic examples of this is the story of the conversion of Herbert Kappler, who served as the head of the SS in Rome towards the end of World War II. Kappler's efforts to arrest Allied fugitives in Rome during the war were routinely foiled by the work of Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty, who was an Irish priest that worked in the Vatican, work that led Kappler to target O'Flaherty for kidnapping and assassination. O'Flaherty continued throughout the rest of the war to try and save Allied fugitives from arrest by the Germans, eventually saving the lives of an estimated 6500 soldiers (although he is obviously not able to save everyone, and a number of those soldiers became victims of Kappler and his SS.) After the war, O'Flaherty receives honors from many Allied governments and Kappler is arrested and sentenced to spend the rest of his life in an Italian prison. However, curiously, O'Flaherty regularly visited Kappler during his imprisonment and eventually became Kappler's only visitor. By 1959, fourteen years after his arrest, Kappler was received into the Catholic Church by Monsignor O'Flaherty. So, in light of the conversion of St. Paul, let us make sure to remember that while some conversions happen in a similar way, most conversions happen like Kappler's: a two-way street that requires a long journey and sincere accompaniment.

Our Kindergarten students in Room 24 are always excited about learning. We have a few more weeks of school remaining to show others that we are prepared to enter First Grade as we will graduate on June 8th! Our focus for the remainder of this School Year will be on "*hands-on*" Math, Reading, and Science activities as well as on continuing our celebration of the Easter Season.

Our class knows that Easter isn't just one day, it is a season in the Church for us to celebrate. Before Easter, we learned about the events of Jesus' life during Holy Week. Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



"Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start." (Pope Francis) We have a difficult time figuring out what is true and best for us. There are many voices talking and so many trying to get our attention. We wrongly convince ourselves that the true voice is the voice of progress, the one that speaks of contemporary wants and desires, enticing us with the latest trends and causes. We are taught, by listening to the voices around us, that truth is found in feelings and thought, and ideals must match current and popular human wants. Because

we feel a particular way it must be true. Then, we find a shepherd who empathizes with us and affirms us. We follow that voice even though listening to that voice will render us powerless and lead us to harm. There are many with me in this procession to this pasture. I must be on the right path and listening to the right voice.

We are very confused. What can keep us safe and from harm? Where do we go to find life, love, and happiness? Jesus tells us that he is the way, the truth, and the life. The only way to get to Truth, who is God, is through him. There is no other way. The Church, the gate around God's pasture of life, is charged with the mission of directing us where God desires that we go. In the midst of all of the conflicting voices around us, the voice of truth is often muffled in all of the noise, but it beckons us to a life of virtue and grace. Helping us understand who we are and where we have to be, it discerns the voice of God, providing us with the safety net we need to stay straight on our path to life eternal.

We have to trust the voice of God, the true Shepherd, even when it does not mirror what we want and what others may believe. Faith goes way beyond feeling and involves a radical trust in Someone who can lead us and form us. At day's end, if we do not know to find our way home, we will be truly lost. ©LPi
