So begins the Constitution of the United States of America. This year's incoming Class of 2021 began our school year preparing to take both the United States Constitution test as well as the Illinois Constitution test. In the past, our Middle School students would take these two required tests over the course of their last two school years at IC. This year, COVID-19 altered our usual preparation schedule. As seventh graders, our Class of 2021 started studying the U.S. Constitution in school, and just before it was time to take the big test - our state mandated quarantine prevented us from taking the test in-person.

As we returned to in-classroom learning this past August, our entire Class of 2021 painstakingly reviewed their Constitution materials and flashcards to study and prepare for taking the U.S. Constitution test and I am happy to report that our great group of Upper Classmen successfully passed that grueling assessment. With that major milestone out of the way, the Class of 2021 jumped into studying the Illinois Constitution after a brief classroom break to relax. Our senior Cowboys will finish the first trimester of the 2020 - 2021 school year completing two major requirements for graduation and are well on their way to becoming well-informed American citizens, with an in-depth understanding of how democracy works, the origins of the U.S. Constitution, how the Constitution is organized and its meaning, and how our government works within it.







Novena to the Immaculate Conception

As previously announced, we will regrettably not be able to gather in our Church this year for our annual Immaculate Conception Novena due to the pandemic. The Novena traditionally begins on **November 30th** and concludes on our parish's Feast Day, **December 8th**. For those who are not computer savvy, here is one novena you can do from the comfort and safety of your home:

Prayer to the Immaculate Conception (each day): O God, who by the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, did prepare a worthy dwelling place for

Your Son, we beseech You that, as by the foreseen death of this, Your Son, You did preserve Her from all stain, so too You would permit us, purified through Her intercession, to come unto You. Through the same Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, world without end. Amen. (State your personal request here.)

November 30th: For grace on the Shepherds of our Archdiocese, living and deceased who like Mary have strived to live lives of Holiness to inspire the people of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

December 1st: Remember the priests, living & deceased of our Archdiocese who are called to serve the vineyard of Chicago with the same filial devotion. May they fall under your shadow of protection to have the strength and courage to be ministers of word and sacrament to the people of God.

December 2nd: For the young people of our Archdiocese who learn the faith through our Catholic School and Religious Education. May your divine love of your Son inspire them to learn and grow in the grace and love of Christ.

December 3rd: For the charities of the Archdiocese of Chicago who serve the poor, the marginalized, and the alienated. May their outreach be the hand of Christ who recognized the face of God in each human person.

December 4th: For our brothers and sisters who have left the Church, that they might accept the invitation to return and worship with us.

December 5th: That parishes become evangelizing parishes, sharing faith through Christian witness and service.

December 6th: For Immaculate Conception Parish, that we will live out our mission statement: "To Love God, Serve Others, and Make Disciples."

December 7th: That each of us will take the opportunity to invite someone who has drifted away from the church to come back home and that they feel truly accepted upon their return.

December 8th: For those preparing for marriage and those who are married, that they live out the covenant relationship of the sacrament of marriage.

Pray one "Our Father", one "Hail Mary", and one "Glory Be", and the Concluding Prayer: *O Mary of the Immaculate Conception, Mother of Christ, you had influence with your Divine Son while upon this earth; you have the same influence now in heaven. Pray for us and obtain for us from Him the granting of this petition if it be the Divine Will. Amen.* (You may also add the Rosary, Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary [Litany of Loretto], and the Memorare as well.) – Deacon Rick Moritz



Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us. ©LPi

However, no matter what happens, Jesus Christ is there to welcome us to the unexpected. He will celebrate with us in joy and he will even feel our pain. You can count on the unexpected, but you can also count on Him to be there with you. He is now and forever, Emmanuel, "God with us." He is the expected in all things unexpected.
