Financial Report For Fiscal Year 2021

As a sidenote for those interested: the fiscal year (FY) is from July 1st to June 30th. As such, the FY for 2021 represents July 2020 – June 2021.

In these past two years, especially from the onset of COVID, we have seen great generosity and support from our parishioners. Whether you gave what little you had during a difficult economic time, or you had the means to give more, the staff and I are entirely appreciative of your generosity. During the worst days of the pandemic,



people were faithful with envelopes and mailings. As we expanded our online offerings and infrastructure, a great percentage of you have given electronically. Thank you, truly, for your generosity.

I was also pleasantly, and immensely, surprised by the bequests we received last year. While it is difficult to predict or expect bequests, I know that one of them came from a long-time parishioner whom I anointed, another who was visited regularly by one of our lay ministers, and a third who had a long history here at IC. Each of them was kind enough to remember us in their wills. Through their thoughtfulness, we as a Parish Council, Finance Council, and staff have had a greater opportunity to discuss priorities around our facilities and programs.

In the future, Vince and I hope to work on future communications asking our parishioners to consider IC in your will. While bequests of \$75,000+ are beyond generous, even more modest gifts of 1, 5, and 10 thousand supplement and promote our charitable works.

The past two years have seen both the trials and triumphs of schooling during COVID. I am extremely grateful to our wonderful staff, led by Mrs. Sue Canzoneri and Mrs. Tina Fitzgerald, our Principal and Assistant Principal, respectively. COVID was not only about safety, but also balancing the very human elements of stress and anxiety along with our professional duty to educate your children. To our whole staff who put on many hats and had to adapt to many changing things, I see our increased enrollment as a testament to their dedication and professionalism.

Similarly, to my own staff: Melissa, Scott, Vince, Cookie, Lisa, Marilyn, Mike, Tony, Elizabeth and Deacons Rick, Ron, and Mike along with Fr. Robert. I thank them for all of their tireless work, flexibility, and passion for IC. None of what we have accomplished these past two years would be possible without the excellent teams around me in our parish, school, councils, and auxiliary groups.

We have worked on many projects recently. This is a part of our commitment to invest your money into improving ourselves: sound system, video, livestreaming and internet, renovating our Parish Office and Rectory Assembly. All of these are a result of your generosity. Furthermore, we are charting out various timetables — gradually at this time — for major school improvements such as HVAC updates (mechanical and software), improving our security system, asbestos abatement, new flooring for classrooms, and much needed tuckpointing around the school campus.

We are likewise investing in our hospitality offerings as well as our Alpha teams. Just as we invest in the place where we host our prayer and community, we are looking to invest in our leaders too.

Becoming a pastor is a big event in any priest's life, and as I begin my second year as pastor in a pandemic, there is a lot that I'm still learning and balancing. Certainly, first and foremost, pray for me that I may keep my leadership focused on the mission of our Church and parish: loving God with my whole heart, forming disciples, and caring for souls.

Lastly, allow me to thank in a special way our Finance Council members who guide me and review crucial financial information: Stephanie Argamaso (president), Amy Reichle, Karl Miehlich, Rose Kopec, and Ed Peters (School Board Representative). To our members who recently concluded their time with us in the past year as well: Patty Nedved, Ed Niewinski, and Rita Zambon.

Thank you to everyone once again. Please take a moment to review our financial overview of the past two years.

NOTES

- IC Parish began Fiscal Year 2021 emerging from the COVID lockdown. Policies and procedures were
 established in order to open-up our church and school. Social distancing and mask wearing became
 the norm and has continued through to today. Mass attendance was limited and school enrollment
 dropped creating a challenge.
- IC Church and School applied for and received a SBA-PPP loan. The Church received \$88,284 and the School was awarded \$466,334. Both loans, amounting to \$554,618,were forgiven in September, 2020 and turned into Extraordinary Income.
- The parishioners of IC continued to show their support and generosity throughout these difficult times. Although our attendance overall was down we continued to receive support through the mail, our drop box and especially through Give Central, our electronic giving platform. The electronic giving increased 16% this last fiscal year.
- The school began the year with 469 students, down 42 from 511 fiscal year 2020. As of today the school currently has a total of 538 students enrolled and 60 new families. The school is looking as healthy as ever for fiscal year 2022.







Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



On December 10, 1979, a very petite holy woman known as Mother Teresa of Calcutta spoke these words in her Nobel Peace Prize Acceptance Speech, "But I am sure in the families and many of our homes, maybe we are not hungry for a piece of bread, but maybe there is somebody there in the family who is unwanted, unloved, uncared, forgotten, there isn't love. Love begins at home. And love to be true has to hurt. I never forget a little child who taught me a very beautiful lesson. They heard in Calcutta, the children, that Mother Teresa had no sugar for her children, and this little one, Hindu boy four years old, he went home and he told his parents: I will

not eat sugar for three days, I will give my sugar to Mother Teresa. How much a little child can give. After three days they brought into our house, and there was this little one who could scarcely pronounce my name, he loved with great love, he loved until it hurt. And this is what I bring before you, to love one another until it hurts, but don't forget that there are many children, many men and women who haven't got what you have. And remember to love them until it hurts."

Living authentically and walking with holiness always involves sacrifice. It has to hurt. Only actions springing from true and deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even what is apparently a generous gesture can be nothing. It is no wonder that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus and the young child in our story above the interest of Mother Teresa. It is easy to make the houses of our lives look like they are in perfect order when in fact they are in shambles within. Religion can sometimes make this hypocritical masquerade easy to accomplish. We can find ourselves in all the right holy places, reciting all of the correct prayers, participating in community collections, and reciting the proper doctrines only to find ourselves empty, shallow, self-focused, and overly anxious about personal concerns.

The one who learns to discover their inner poverty, their spiritual poverty, is the only one who can truly place him or herself at the mercy of God. It is only when we allow ourselves to be empty that we realize Who we actually need to fill us. This is the real meaning of trust. Many of us are afraid to take the plunge. We allow ourselves to detach from only so much, always keeping a watchful eye on the protection of our securities. We understand the value of poverty, but we do not want to become too poor. As long as we are able to recognize this tension, our reluctance to let go and our struggle, we can continue our journey of humbly learning how to love so deeply that it hurts. God understands and waits. ©LPi
