Leadership Day @ Immaculate Conception

This past Saturday, we hosted a Day of Reflection here at Immaculate Conception. As an open invitation to leaders in our parish who serve IC in various capacities (e.g., staff, councils, boards, ministers, etc.), I was happy to see 32 participants join us over the course of the day.

The foundation of our day was this notion: all of faith and leadership is God's work. That is to say, all of faith is a response to the immensity of God's love. Hence, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you" (In 15

God's love. Hence, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you" (Jn 15:16). If our leadership is more a response than an act of our own will, it emphasizes the importance of awareness of God's voice in our lives.

To that end, much of the day was spent in conversation with one another. Leadership in the Church must be modeled after Christ. He spent time with his disciples. He knew them. One of the reflections that came from the day is the 'power of being known.' When an usher/greeter remembers your name, or a neighbor remembers an anniversary, or someone says a kind word after a personal loss, we feel known—we feel loved.

This is precisely why these small group efforts are important for us at IC. Knowing each other in the context of faith—not simply through parties or fundraising events—is essential. It motivates us to serve. More importantly, it impels us to call others to service.

If leadership is God's mode of making us free, then the response to God must be gratitude. Likewise, our response to others is to allow them to feel the same love and freedom we possess.

To that end, I would encourage each parishioner to join us for our faith-based exercises. They are not meant to be burdensome lectures, but genuine opportunities of communal and personal growth.

Consider the following:

Next Sunday, October 30th – Fruitful Harvest (Session I) – On Vocation Join us for a roundtable reflection with our Seminarians, Joseph & Jacob, on the topic of God's call in the smaller and larger things of life, which will take place after our 10:30 A.M. Mass in our Rectory Assembly. How do we discern God's voice, and how do we understand if we are heading in the right direction? After the main reflection, join us for small group discussion on the subject. Coffee and a light breakfast will be provided.



Sunday, November 20th - Fruitful Harvest (Session II) - Subject TBD

Sunday, December 4th - Coffee House

A hospitality-centric event meant to allow some time for you to meet your neighbor. Fresh coffees, hand-selected by me (last time was Colombia and Sumatra), along with some treats. Future sessions may even feature something special, like a homemade soup to take home for a freewill offering or other baked goods. Meet different teams who will serve as hosts each month. Coffee House is offered after our 8:30 A.M. & 10:30 A.M. Masses (approximately from 9:30 A.M. until 12:30 P.M.) in our Rectory Assembly.

All are welcome to join us for our 60th Anniversary Celebration with an extra-special Mass led by Bishop Bartosic at 7:00 P.M. A light reception will follow afterward in our Parish Center.





Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



There is a thing called "false piety." It is when we wear a religious disguise of devotion, attend to our obligations, and outwardly abide by rules while being inwardly unkind, uncharitable, and exclusive. Wearing the right clothes, saying the proper prayers, being in sacred places, and reading devotional books, those exhibiting false piety craftily try to control others using the pretense of love. The Pharisees, consistently criticized by Jesus, are prime examples. Thinking they are superior to others, they foolishly believe they are better positioned with God and more worthy of God's attention. Forming an exclusive "club," they divide things


between "mine" and "yours" and "us" and "them." They quickly criticize and point out flaws and errors in rituals and thinking. Conformity becomes the first commandment and control is the game's name.

The requirements for "club membership" are clear: do what we do, think what we think, and believe what we believe. Attempting to control others using the lure of "status" or "salvation," they seduce others into thinking that conformity is the only way to holiness. Clinging to "my beliefs," "my parish," "my way of thinking," they fail to see the more significant relationship with God that is veiled in all of these superficial rules and practices. Shallow, hollow, and empty vessels, they gloss over the more important virtues of justice, mercy, faithfulness, and forgiveness. Sparkling clean on the outside, but dirty on the inside. Spiritual arrogance is a grave sin. It alienates and hurts the little ones, those considered "least" in the kingdom.

God knows no favorites. Everyone belongs regardless of whether you are an official, bona fide member. Sometimes membership may be a detriment to actually living the Gospel if you're joining the team for the wrong reasons. The genuinely humble ones may not appear to be overly "pious." They may not know all of the proper prayers or abide by all of the correct rituals, but they know that they are broken and need mercy. There is no shame in being broken. In fact, many things need to be broken in order to be what they truly are! There is a reason Jesus told us to pray in private. It's only between you and God. It is nobody else's business. ©LPi



Saint of The Week - Examples of Our Faith: Saint Anthony Mary Claret (October 24th)

Saint Anthony Mary Claret is also known as the "spiritual father of Cuba." He was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. He became a weaver, like his father, and was very talented. But he studied in his spare time to become a priest and was ordained in 1835. In 1849 the saint founded the Claretians, a religious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.

From 1850 to 1857 he served as Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, where he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage and instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms instead of the mass farming of a sugar cash crop. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins.

He was recalled to act as Queen Isabella II's confessor, a duty he reluctantly agreed to, with the exceptions that he would reside away from the court, attending the household only to hear confessions and instruct the children. While in Spain, he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He went into exile to France with the Queen's household during the Spanish Revolution of 1868.

The saint returned to Rome to Participate in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. He died in France in 1870 and was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. ©LPi


