Financial Report For Fiscal Year Ending June, 2020*

*The Previous Year in Review and Outlook*

Dear all,

Contained in this bulletin is our financial year in review (Fiscal Year Jul 2019 – June 2020). Within a simple twelve months, a lot has happened, much of which you are already aware. During this time, I've endeavored to work closely with our Parish Council, Finance Council, and Staff to be a proper steward of the gifts you give to our parish, namely your lives, your spirituality, your families, and your money.



We accomplished many projects last year: tuckpointing our Church, repairing the masonry of our tower, fixing the roof of our Church and Parish Office, renovating our Rectory Assembly, re-carpeting our Church, fundraising for our new sound system, and rewiring our Parish Office.

We hope that the attention we have paid towards improving our house of worship alone is evidence of our responsibility with your donations. This wasn't enough, however, because with the help of Fr. Robert Fedek we, along with our parish leadership, also endeavored to improve our focus by establishing long-term goals for ministry here at our parish.

We introduced our Alpha program, which most of our Staff and leaders participated in, to invest in our spiritual growth. From these sessions, we have built a team to lead future Alpha groups – something you will hear more about in November and December. I have invested time to meet regularly with our CLT (Core Leadership Team) - composed of Staff members and Michael Tom (Evangelization Lead) - to establish regular action items and plans. This has allowed us to remain focused on our priorities, keep timetables, and accomplish small and large goals.

Already in these past four months, we have re-carpeted our Parish Office, improved our internet, offered online services, incorporated online meetings, initiated training for our Alpha and Evangelization Team, installed our new sound system (currently in progress as of my writing), fixed water damage in our Parish Office, and reopened our school.

I could go on to list the many ways our staff and administration has innovated, persevered, and sacrificed for the sake of our school, but I will allow them in their own words to inform you of their hard work. Needless to say, I am grateful for their professionalism and service.

Returning to finances, this time has proven to be a difficult balancing act. While last fiscal year we nearly met our projections – in itself, a great testament to your generosity – this coming year, we project losses. With our limited capacity in reopening our Church, we by default have fewer people coming to Church and, as such, fewer people giving. We understand this, and respect people's conscience in offering what they feel is appropriate. While we have bridged this gap quite well with online giving, nevertheless, we, like many others, will feel the pinch of these restrictions.

The balancing act for us is, on the one hand, cutting our expenses where necessary, while on the other hand, not simply retreating into our shell and waiting this pandemic out. We have used this time of limited traffic to improve our Parish Office, support our musicians and record music for our online services, and assess the needs of our campus. My intention is to position us to grow and thrive from this situation, which means spending money prudently and investing in future growth. Naturally, I rely on Vince (our Director of Operations), our Staff, and Finance Council to keep my expectations realistic. Currently, we are reviewing our first quarter finances in order to adjust our budget (as needed) for the remainder of the year.

As I conclude, I do want to highlight one area of great pride and hope. Along with our Alpha Team and Reopening Team, we have had over 30 members of our parish family step up into leadership roles, assisting us with our Masses, sacraments, and ministry. I count the fruitfulness of our parish as directly related to the generosity of our people in its various forms. Our financial stability and activity in ministry are all because of you, which allows my team and I to move forward with confidence. Thank you for walking with us in what has been an unusual and difficult 2020. Together, by God's grace, we will do good things and even better in the years to come.

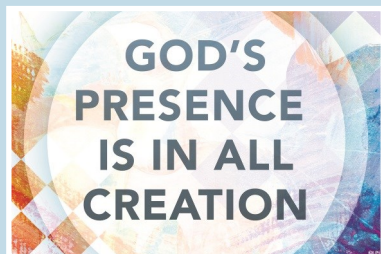


***Congratulations, Sue Canzoneri, Principal of Immaculate Conception School!***

“She is out there every single day, on the front line with the teachers and setting a good example by taking kids temperatures, administering hand sanitizer, etc.,” said a parent who nominated her. “Sue has done a great job keeping parents and students engaged and informed of her school’s COVID-19 safety procedures,” said another parent who nominated Canzoneri. “Reminders were given to students daily (at the beginning) to keep masks on, when on school property, and she used a bullhorn after school to remind the kids, who always wanted to take the mask off as soon as they walked out,” the parent said. “(It) sure did get the kids attention!”



*Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture*



For some reason, it is easier to genuflect in reverence to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle of a church, than to genuflect in reverence to the same presence of Christ in another person's soul. We wrongly believe that God divides himself, placing himself in one place in preference to another. It doesn't work that way. Love of God and love of neighbor are intimately and inseparably connected because the essence and spark of God's very presence is in all creation. God's presence is just as real in the one who is good, as in the one who is bad, and the one who is just, and the one who is unjust.

Our brains get in the way of truly contemplating the awesomeness of this truth. We like to separate things into boxes, the sheep from the goats and the deserving from the undeserving. But, with God there are no distinctions such as this. Our human classifications, subdivisions, and definitions hold no power or have any weight in God's eyes. Sadly, we relate to God and to each other as if they do.

We cannot be deaf to the world's pain. It is not about having, hoarding, accumulating, acquiring, securing, storing, protecting, owning, claiming, or any of the other human terms we use to distinguish mine from yours. We put so much power in these words and that power, even though we may not always realize it, can cause those words and the distinctions they carry to wound and hurt others. We have the whole order of things wrong, but we are so set on preserving this order that we are absolutely afraid to do it any other way. We go through hoops trying to convince ourselves why the perils of the person seeking a new place to call home are not our perils that we turn our back and justify closing our doors. It makes perfect sense to us. Yet, it makes no sense in terms of our faith. It doesn't square with any of the words found in Sacred Scripture or in any time-tested teaching of the church.

We have it all reversed. We know that we do because when Jesus speaks about such things and the words of the Old Testament prophets ring out again, we start to feel uncomfortable and anxious. What we do, directly or by omission, to one of the least of these little ones we do to God. It is quite possible that some of what we are doing personally, economically, politically, globally, and even religiously is doing more harm than good. Let's ponder that a bit.

How is a well-meaning person able to find out the true meaning of love?

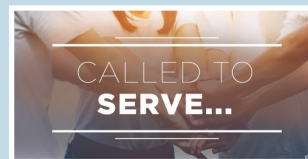
