

60 For 60 Fundraiser Follow-Up

Dear all,

Thank you for taking the time to hear about our new fundraiser. The booklets, available in our office, church, and digitally on our website (icchicago.org/discoveric/60yearanniversary.cfm), outline the scope of the project. My thanks to our early donors as we are currently at about \$11,000 of our \$60,000 goal.

As a brief follow-up to a few questions and comments we received, some inquired about the status of the fountain in front of our church on Talcott. I should have clarified that we have funding to restore that space and it is a separate project that we hope to complete in 2023. Part of the issues surrounding it are the delicacy of the project. The pipes beneath the fountain that connect to the foundation are in awful shape, which has caused a lot of the water issues that we used to get in our baptistry. Along with our iconic Mary statue, which weighs many tons, we want to be as careful as possible with how we approach the issue at hand.

I hope you are able to support our efforts for this campaign knowing that we are not neglecting other areas of our church or campus. Thank you, as always, for your generosity! - *Fr. Matt*





Gospel Meditation - Encourage a Deeper Understanding of Scripture



What virtue is the cornerstone of discipleship? Love. Jesus preached about it, lived it, and summarized his greatest commandment featuring it. Love is in our DNA. To follow Jesus, then, is to follow the path of love. While this may appear to be an attractive and easy option, it most assuredly is not. Authentic love always comes with sacrifice. It is the complete giving of oneself to another. The sacrificial character of love always requires that we leave something aside and pursue something else. This is at the heart of self-denial. Love asks us to make choices that are often difficult.

There is a reason Jesus asks that the love of God come first. "Charity is the right attitude of mind which prefers nothing to the knowledge of God. If a man possesses any strong attachment to the things of this earth, he cannot possess true charity (St. Maximus the Confessor)." "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." A devoted disciple must be single-minded in her quest for God. She cannot allow anyone or anything to have more power over her soul than God. When any earthly attachments become more important than Love, we can get ourselves into trouble.

The Gospel calls us to walk boldly into the darkness, confusion, and emptiness of the world clothed in the mantle of love. We are asked to walk with others on their journey, offering a supportive, healing, challenging, and faithful presence. Ours is not to judge. To walk this sacrificial journey means that I must put myself aside and focus on the needs of others. "A sacrifice to be real must cost, must hurt and must empty ourselves (St. Teresa of Calcutta)." Love helps us walk straight and focus to see things more clearly and help others to do so as well. Many folks struggle to find joy and meaning in life. People may simply need someone with the freedom to sit with them in their pain, so they don't feel so alone. Through acts of kindness, gestures of acceptance, and words of compassion, burdens can be lightened. Believe in God's love and seek it above all other things! ©LPi

Franciscan Works is a Catholic missionary organization dedicated to breaking the cycle of poverty for children and families through material and spiritual support and a Catholic education.

Franciscan Works currently operates Liberia Mission in West Africa. Founded in 2003, just as the civil war was ending, Liberia Mission began with six orphaned children.



Today it is a vibrant, life-saving community of love, learning, work and prayer, with 45 residents. Nearly 450 youth from surrounding villages attend St. Anthony of Padua Mission Grade School or are funded to attend local high schools. These are young people who would not otherwise have access to education, medical care, adequate food and shelter, faith formation, and the sacraments. St. Michael the Archangel Church, located on the Mission, serves the students and the community. A student-run farm and piggery are part of the vocational education the students receive.

These children are learning to become future leaders in their families, communities and country. **Much prayer, joy and hope** is evident at Liberia Mission, even with the sorrow and hardships associated with the Ebola outbreak of 2014, the ongoing pandemic, and the political and economic strife there. Many challenges remain.
